Prostate Grade and Gleason's Score Refresher

The ACCR is seeing a number of coding errors related to prostate grade. Please review the Grade Manual for specific instructions for coding this data item for prostate. For prostate, a TURP or simple prostatectomy qualifies for a clinical grade only.

Codes 1-5 take priority over A-E.

Diagnostic Confirmation MELANOMA

Diagnostic confirmation for melanoma cases receiving a biopsy or excision should be entered as '1' for positive histology. If the physician takes tissue and submits for pathologic examination, then the diagnostic confirmation =1.

You can access this spreadsheet to validate your topography and histology codes to be sure they are accurate. For example: All leukemias except myeloid sarcoma (M-9930/3 should be coded to C42.1 (bone marrow). You can use Cancer PathCHART to validate your coding, especially for hematopoietic and lymphoid neoplasms.
