MONTHLY ABSTRACTOR TIPS

- Skin of Vulva, topography, apply code: C51.9, not a C44 category.
- Positive malignant urine cytology, (in the absence of any other information), topography, apply code: C68.9, per SEER SINQ and Boot Camp 2024 Part 2, NAACCR Webinar Series Q & A. <u>Malignant Urine Cytology</u>, <u>Topography Coding</u>
- Prostate EOD Prostate Pathologic Extension:
 - Code as applicable when surgical procedure is 50-70 (Radical Prostatectomy).
 - Code as 900 when surgical procedure is 00-30, or 90 (NO Radical prostatectomy or autopsy performed).
 - Do not leave blank.
- Bladder TURBT, Grade coding:
 - TURB qualifies for Grade Clinical only, do not apply TURB grade result in Grade Pathologic.
 - o A cystectomy, or partial cystectomy must be performed to qualify for surgical resection and Grade Pathologic.
- Prostate TURP, Grade coding:
 - TURP or simple prostatectomy qualifies for Grade Clinical only, do not apply in Grade Pathologic.
 - o A radical prostatectomy must be performed to qualify for surgical resection and Grade Pathologic.



TEXT: A comprehensive review of the importance of text, format, requirements, etc. will be reviewed in the May 2024 'Text Review' ACCR Educational Webinar Series. Text must provide the rationale for selecting the codes assigned to primary site, histology, extent of disease, and treatment fields. Use of approved abbreviations is acceptable.

TEXT ENTRY EXAMPLES:

1/24/YY ABC Hospital Left breast upper outer quadrant, US guided biopsy positive for infiltrating ductal carcinoma, well differentiated, no DCIS present. ER 67% positive, strong intensity, PR 55% positive, strong intensity, HER2 IHC (1+) negative. Ki-67 13.4%.

PATHOLOGY TEXT ENTRY:

Incorrect

Infiltrating ductal carcinoma, no DCIS.

Correct

11/24/YY ABC Hospital, LT UOQ breast, US guided bx + for IDC, WD, no DCIS. *Include date, location and name of procedure, grade and other notable findings.

LABS TEXT ENTRY:

Incorrect Blank Correct

11/24/YY ER+ 67% strong intensity, PR+ 55% strong intensity, HER2 IHC (1+) neg, KI-67: 13.4. *Include date, result and whether high/low, positive/negative, etc., include information to support coded SSDI and other fields.

RULES FOR ARKANSAS CANCER CASE REPORTING

In accordance with Arkansas cancer reporting law, all licensed health care facilities and providers are required to report cancer cases to the ACCR no later than six months after the date of diagnosis of cancer and/or initial treatment of cancer.

All cancer cases that were diagnosed or began initial treatment on or before **November 30, 2023**, should have been reported to ACCR. If you still have cases remaining from this period, report them immediately. Cases should be reported via WebPlus.
