## PREFACE

This report is based on information obtained by licensing boards during the 2013 license renewal process. Copies of practitioner responses to questions on license renewal applications were provided to the Health Statistics Branch by the licensing boards. It should be noted that, because the data was collected by several boards using questionnaires designed to meet the licensing requirements of the individual professions, a certain consistency of format and content, desirable for manpower measurement, is missing from the data. Various items of demographic data, e.g., ethnic origin and gender, are obtained by some, but not all, of the boards. Information relating to a practitioner's location- address, city, county, state, etc.- meets the licensing board's need to communicate with the practitioner by mail and may or may not identify the site(s) where health related services are actually performed.

The report includes tables, maps and graphs representing health professions manpower distribution and demographics in Arkansas counties. The 2010 Census from the U.S. Census Bureau, Population Division, was used in the computation of population ratios throughout this report.

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**Acknowledgement:** We wish to express our gratitude to the licensing boards of these professions for their cooperation in providing requested access to their license-renewal files.

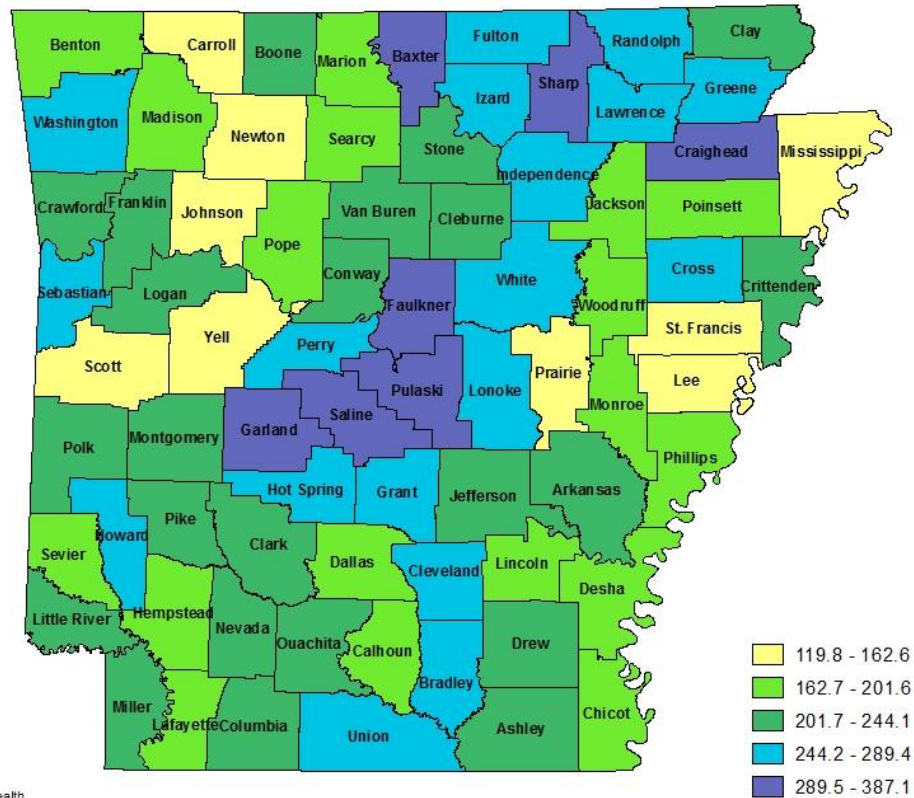
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## Health Professionals in Arkansas

In 2013, there were 78,587 licensed health professionals with Arkansas mailing addresses serving 2.95 million Arkansans, a population ratio of 265 professionals for every 10,000 population living in the State. There were 17 professions administered by 13 boards. The largest registration was by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing with 48,537 licensees, followed by the Arkansas State Medical Board with 9,660 licensees. The smallest registration was by the Arkansas Board of Podiatric Medicine with 71 licensees. As a group, health professionals were distributed fairly evenly across the counties with a heavier concentration in counties with larger populations.

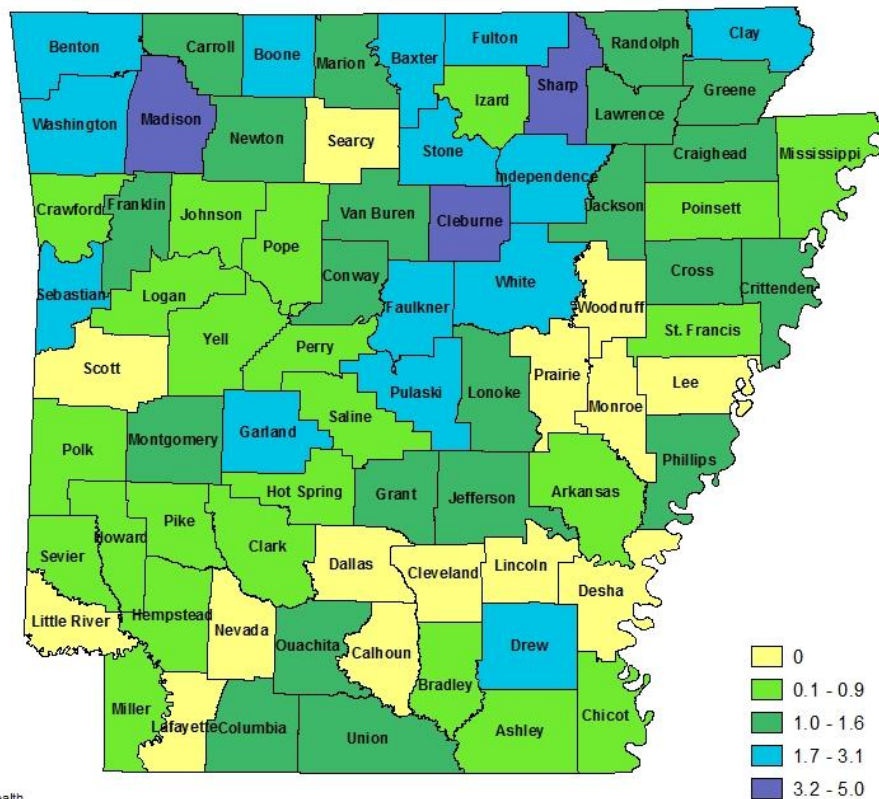

## Chiropractors in Arkansas

In 2013, the Board of Chiropractic Examiners licensed 506 chiropractors with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 1.7 per 10,000 populations. Of the 75 counties in Arkansas, 14 counties (19%) had no registered chiropractors and 14 other counties (19%) had only one.

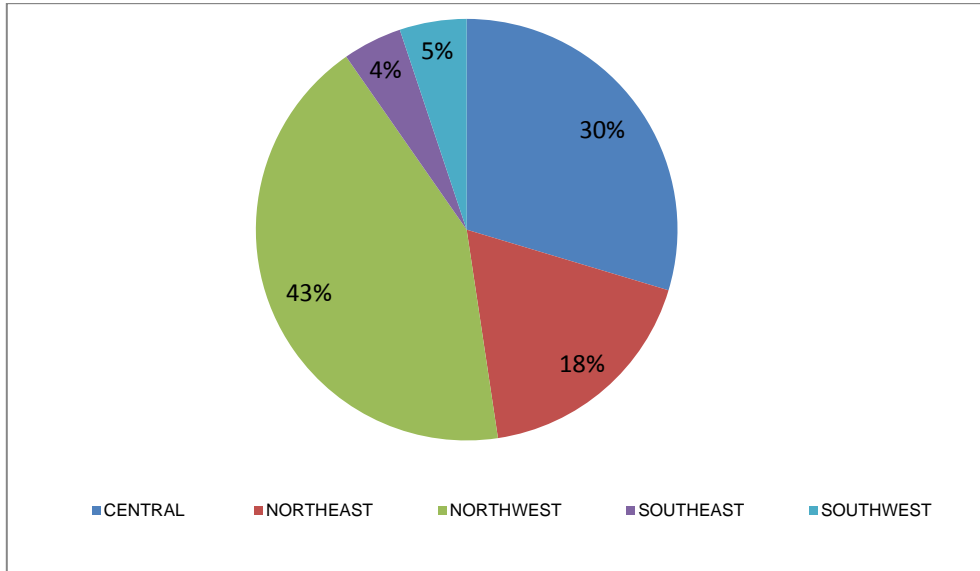
### Chiropractors by Counties Per 10,000 Population



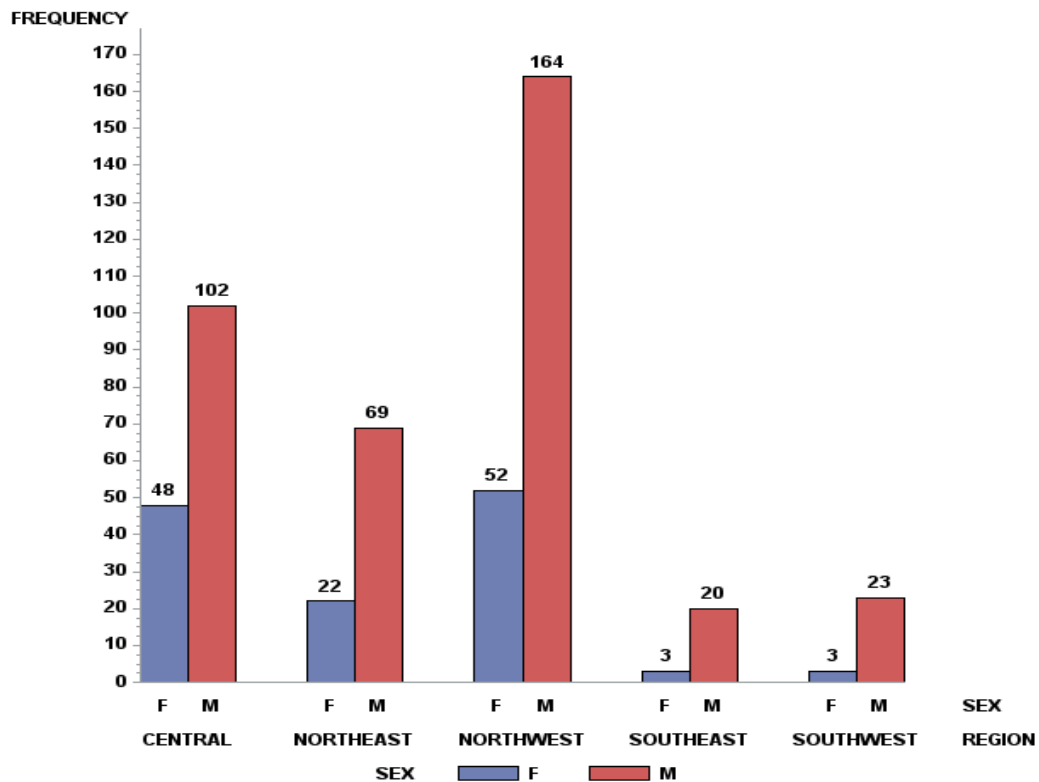

The following graphs show the distribution of chiropractors based on five Arkansas regions: Central, Northeast, Northwest, Southeast, and Southwest. The Central and Northwest regions accounted for approximately 73% of chiropractors in the state.

The gender distribution of chiropractors is heavily skewed towards males, 75%, with only 25%, females.

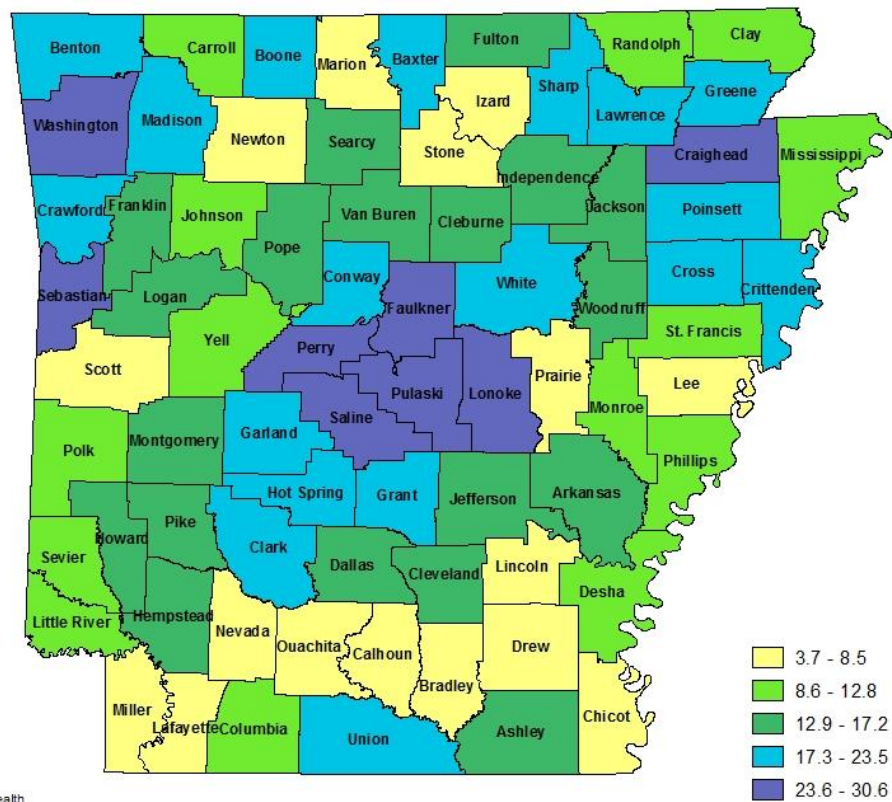

## Dental Health Providers in Arkansas

In 2013, the Board of Dental Examiners licensed 6,013 providers of dental health services with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 20 per 10,000 populations. This total includes 1,268 dentists (D), 3,247 dental assistants (DA), and 1,498 dental hygienists (DH). Overall, the number of dental health providers decreased by 0.5% for the state. Individually there was a decrease in DA by 4.2%, an increase in DH by 5.1%, and an increase in D by 3.3%. Each of the 75 counties in Arkansas had at least three registered dental health providers.

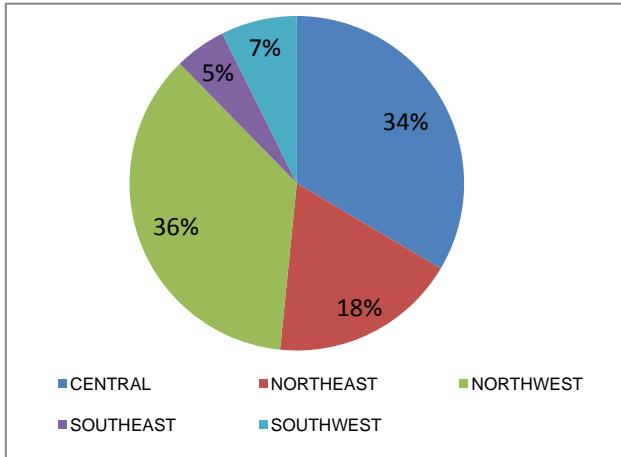
### Dental Health Providers by Counties Per 10,000 Population



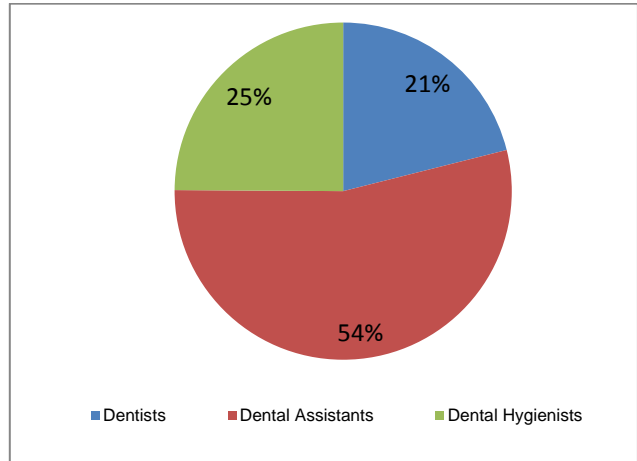

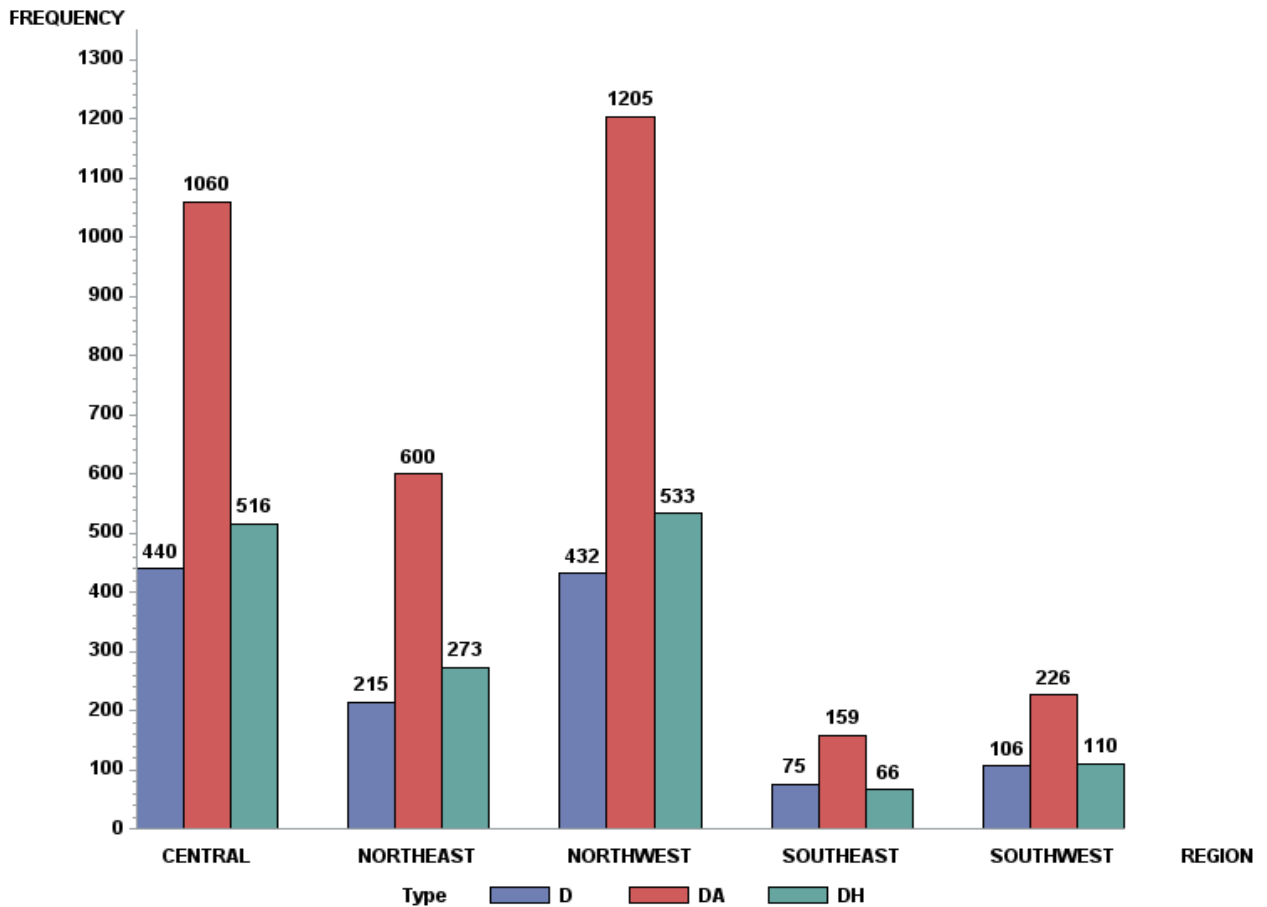
**Distribution of Dental Providers by Region**



**Distribution of Dental Providers by Specialty**

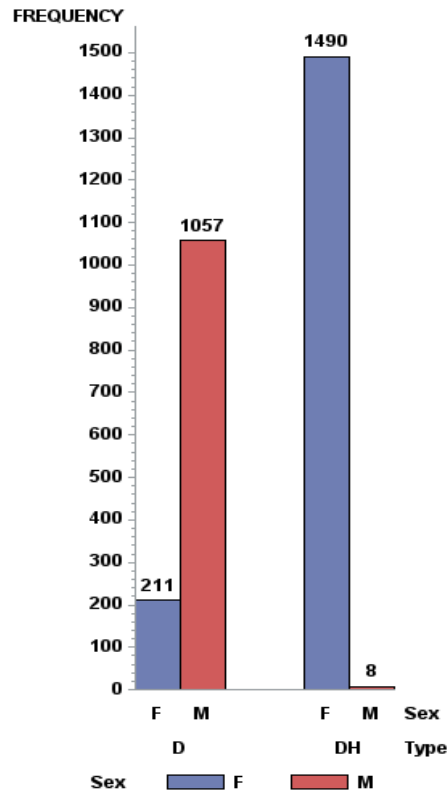


**Dental Health Providers by Regions**

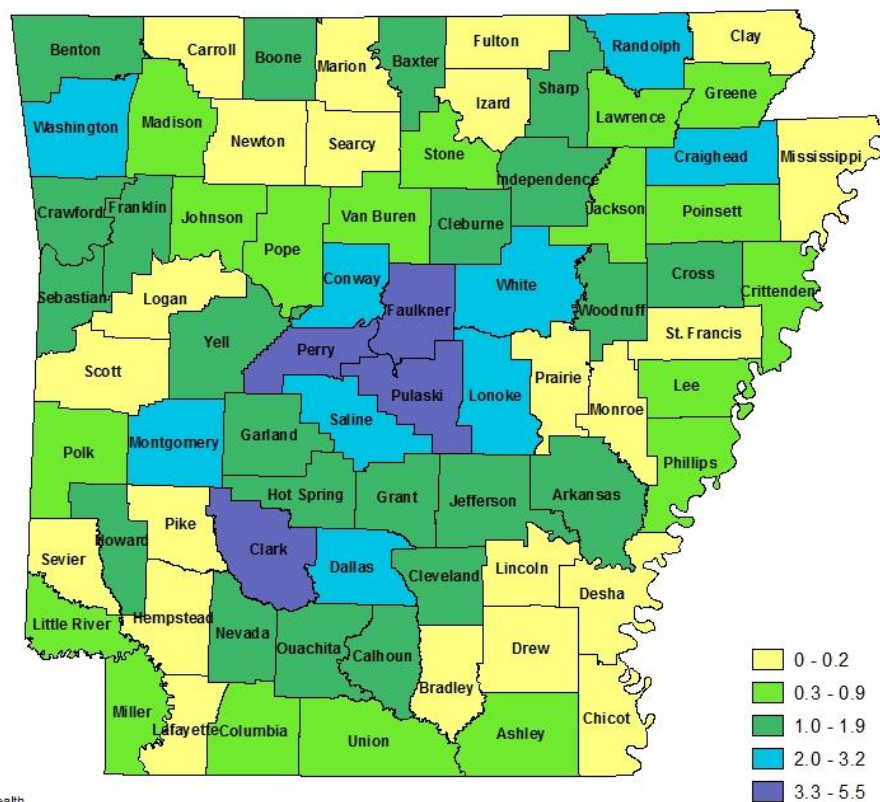

### Dietitians by Counties Per 10,000 Population



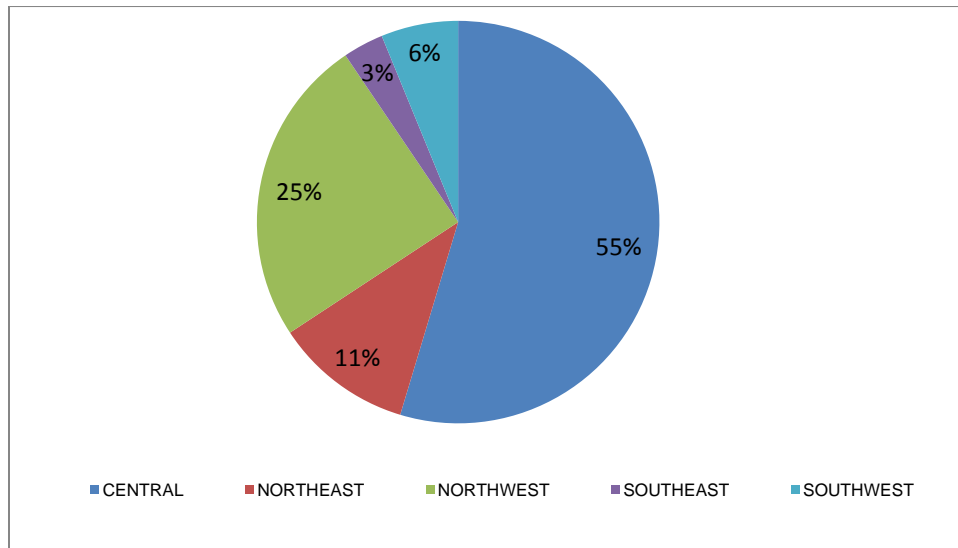

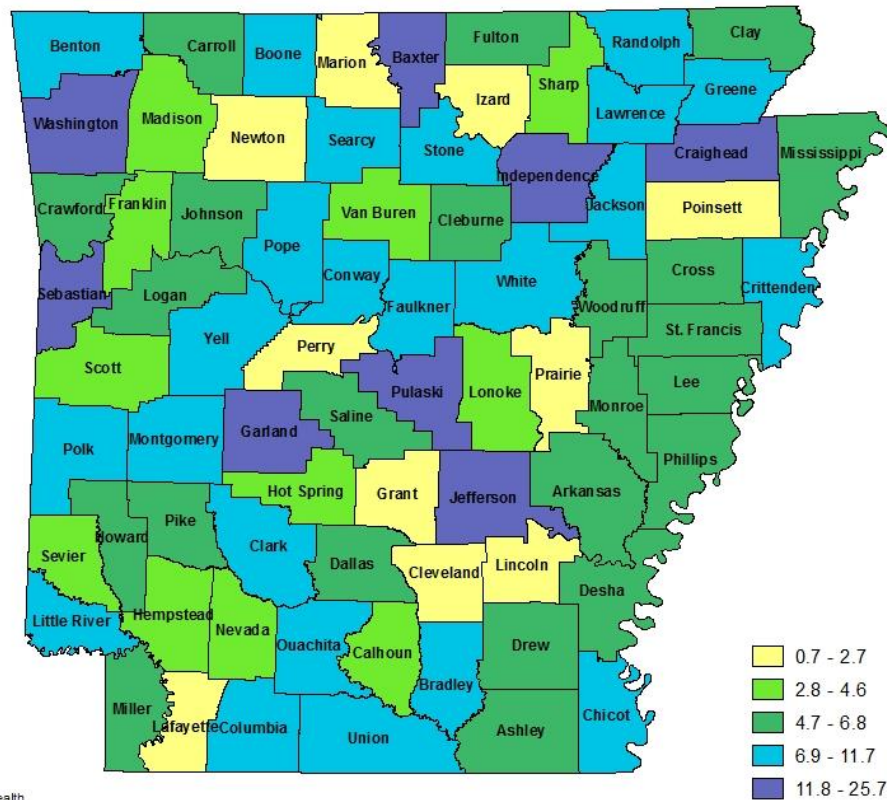

## Medical (Doctors) in Arkansas

In 2013, the Medical Board licensed 9,660 health professionals with mailing addresses in Arkansas. The 2013 registry includes 3,269 physicians (35%) registered in five primary care specialties with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 11 per 10,000 population. This list includes: 1,402 family practice, 96 general practice, 937 internal medicine, 304 obstetrics-gynecologists (OB/GYN), and 530 pediatrics. At least one fully licensed primary care physician was registered in each Arkansas County. The board licensed 2,912 physicians as secondary specialists and 38 physicians who reported no specialty. Also, the board licensed 3,441 health professionals as Health Related Professionals. This total is made up of 1,720 Respiratory Therapists (LRCP), 1,172 Occupational Therapists (OT), 331 Occupational Therapy Assistants (OT-A), 211 Physician Assistants (PA), 3 Radiologists (RA) and 4 Radiology Assistants (RPA).

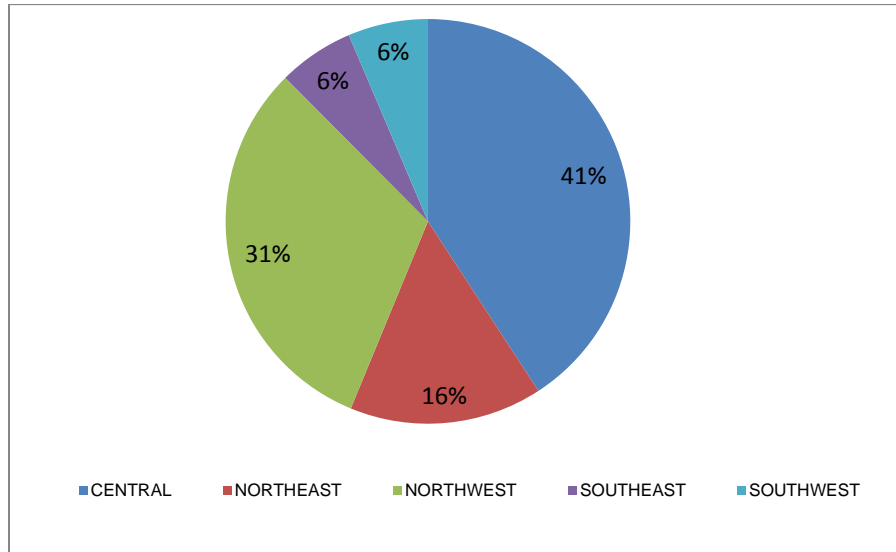
### Primary Care Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population



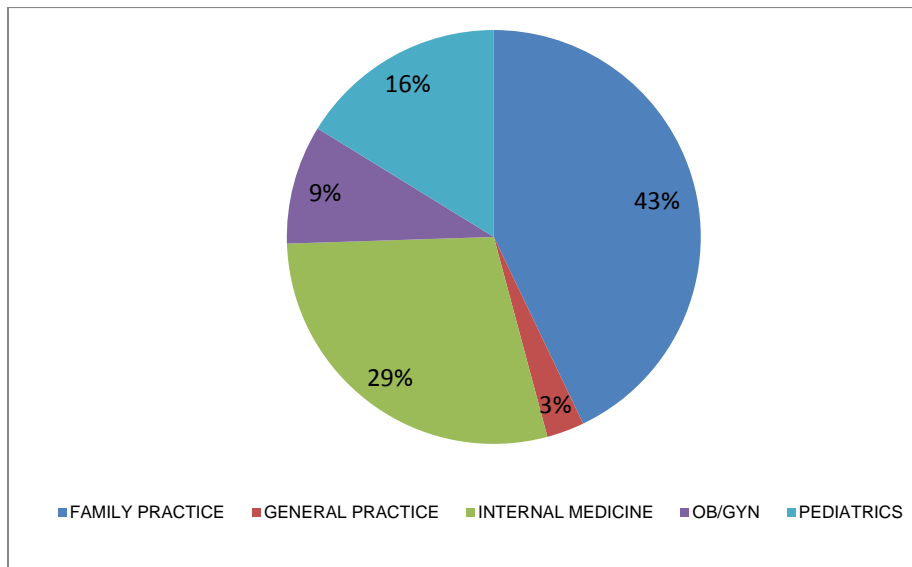

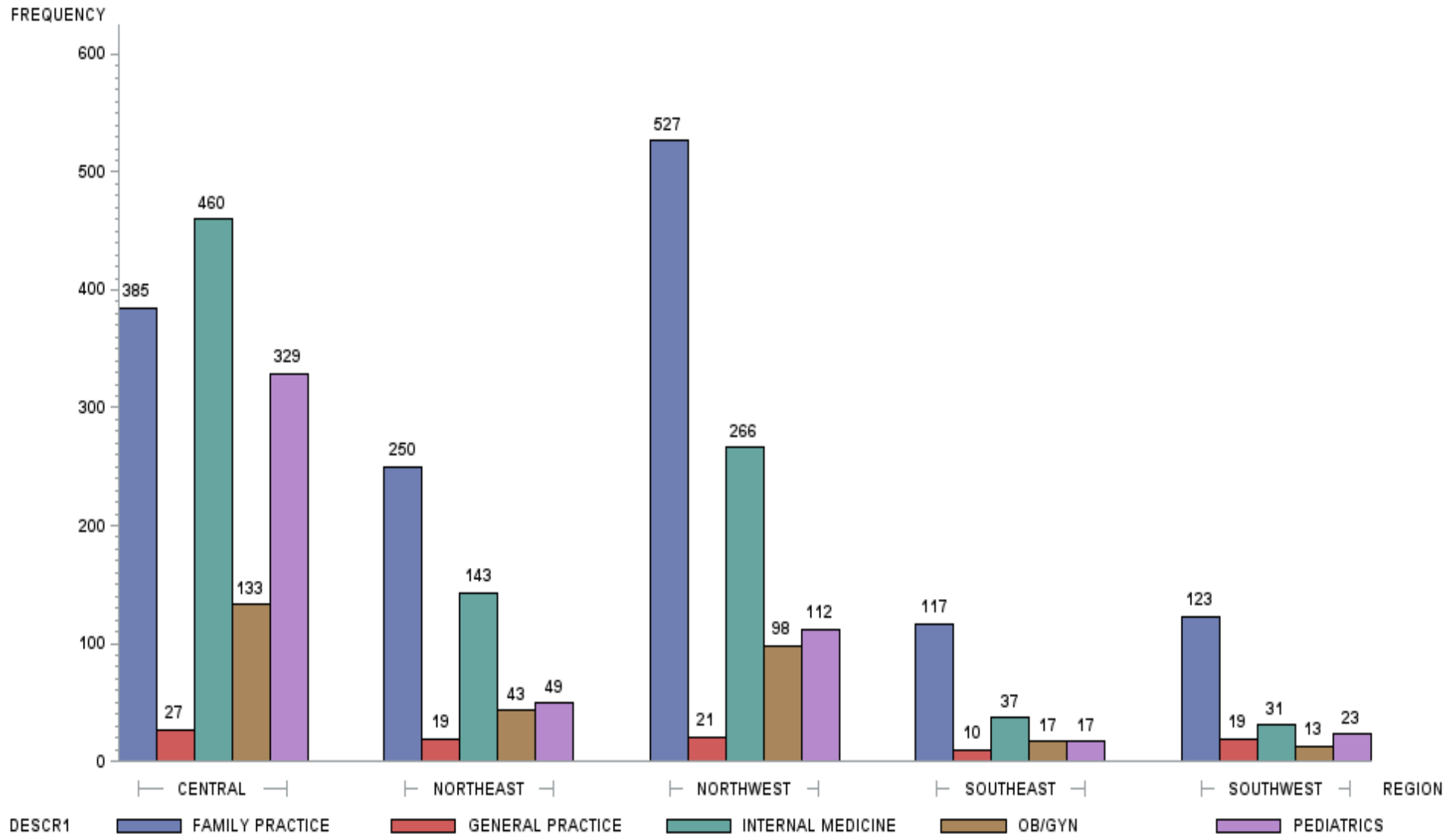
**Distribution of Primary Care Physicians by Region**



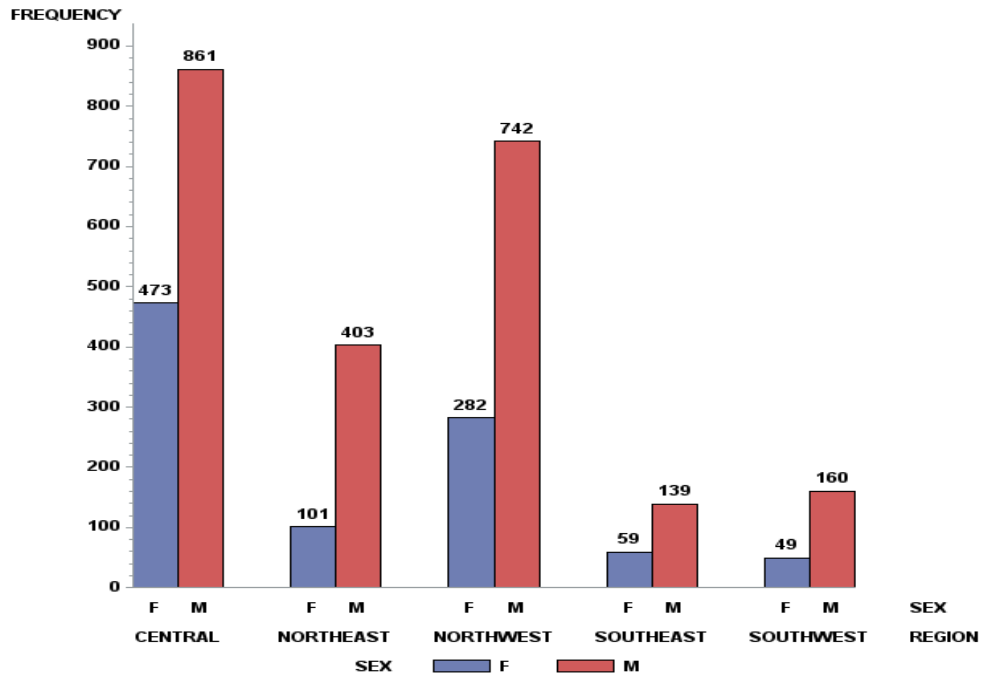
**Distribution of Primary Care Physicians by Specialty**



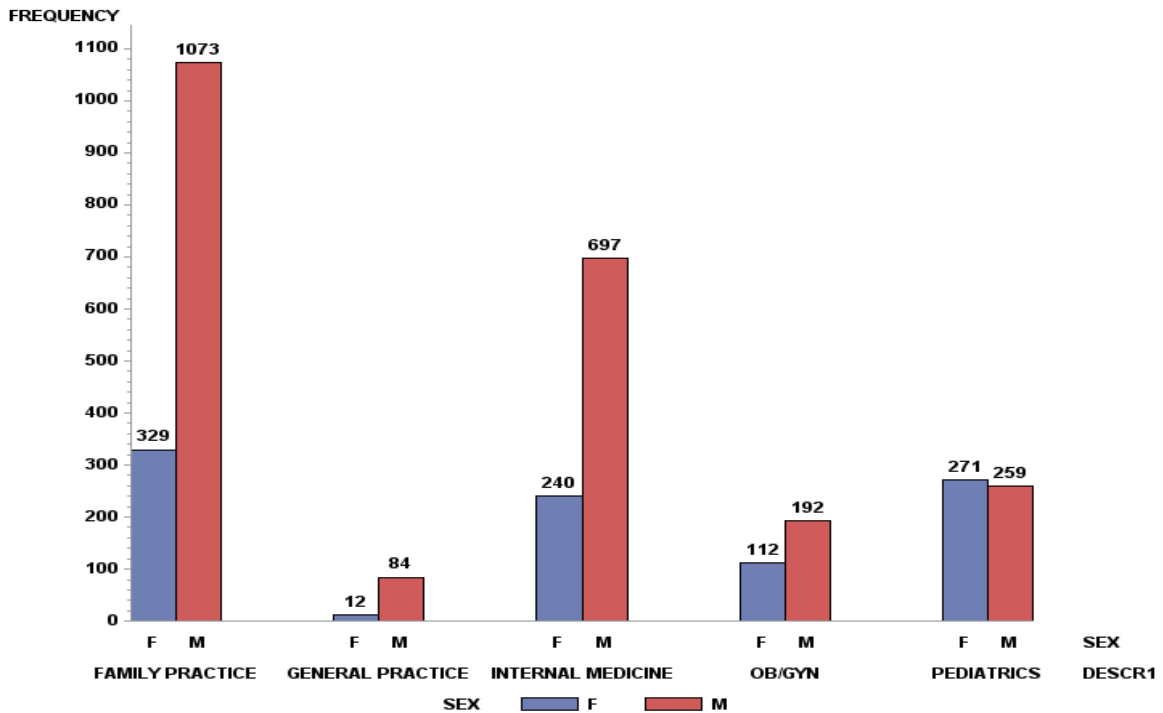
## Primary Care Physicians by Regions and Specialty

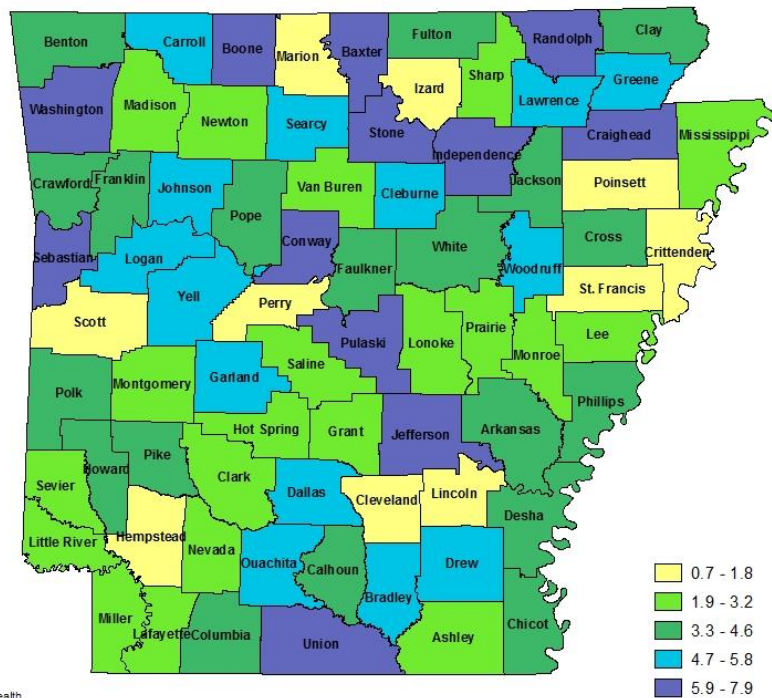

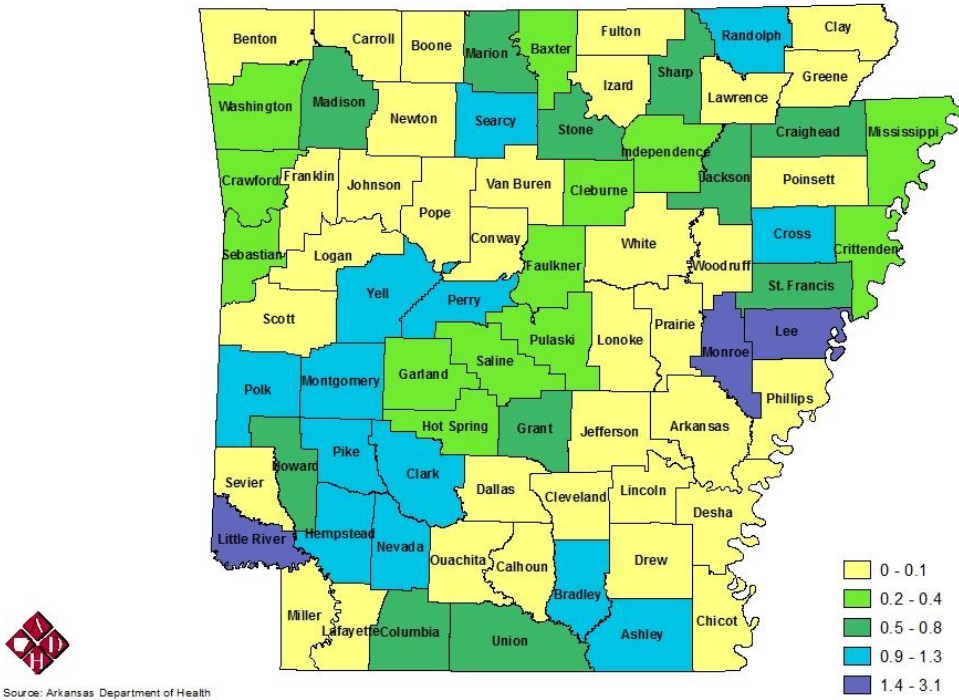

### Family Practice Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population

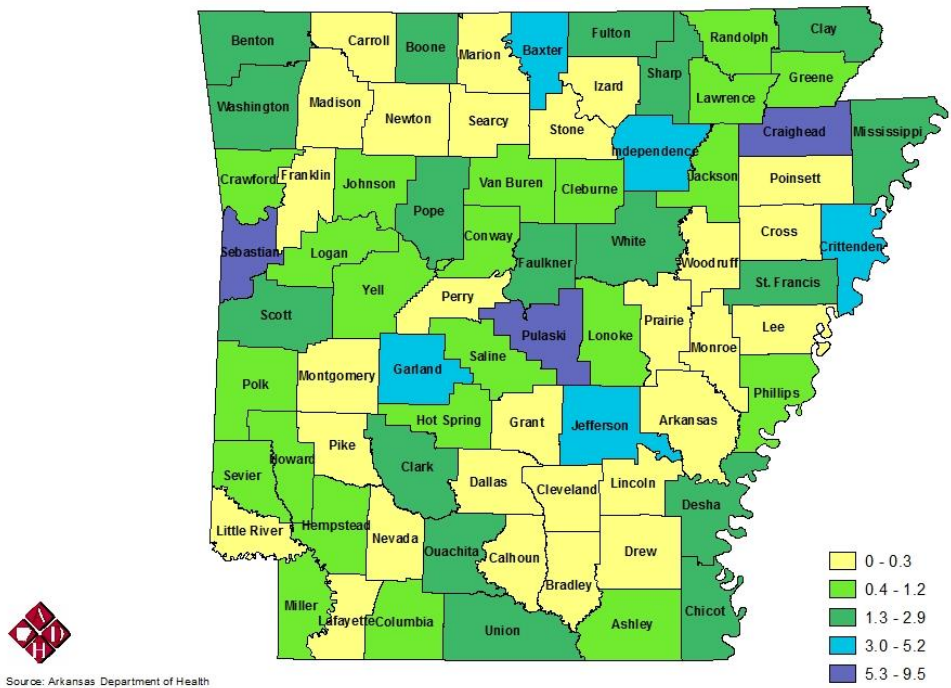

## General Practice Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population

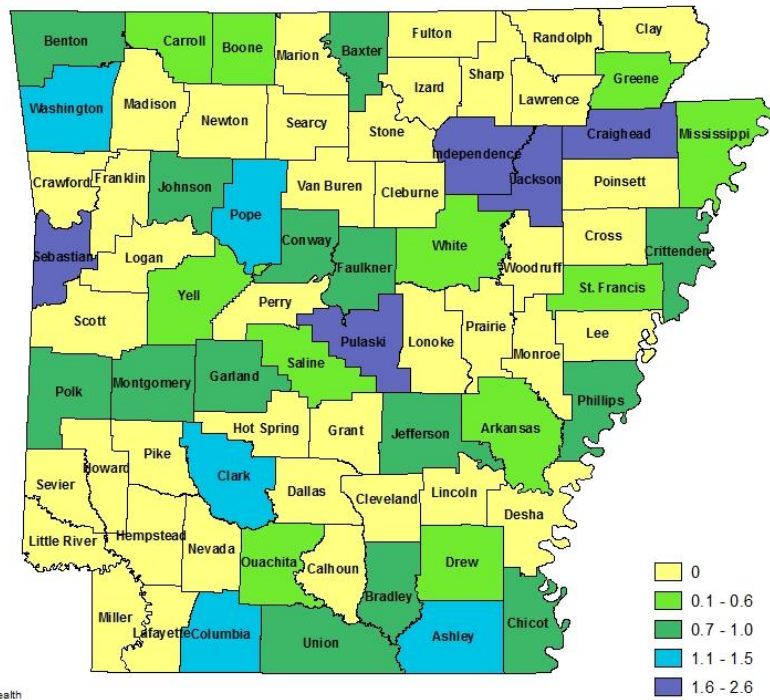


## Internal Medicine Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population



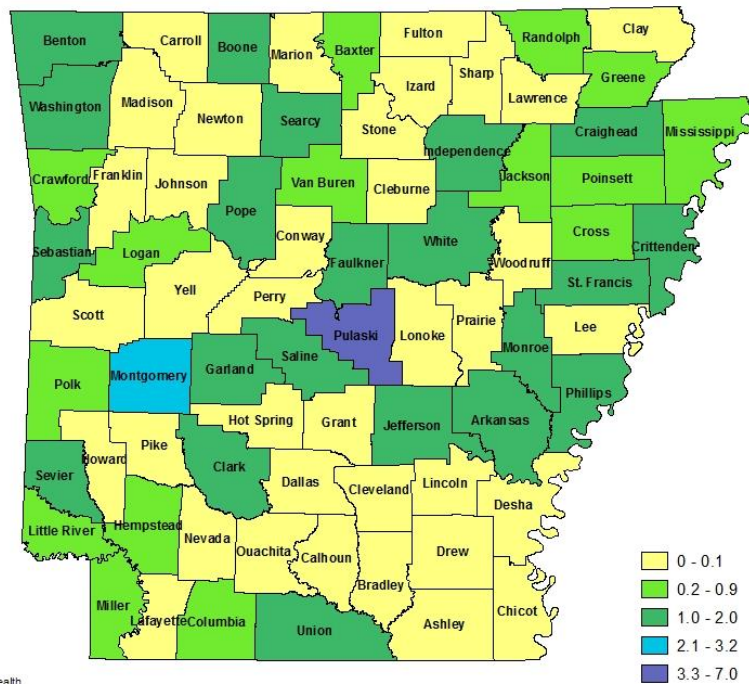


## OB/GYN Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population

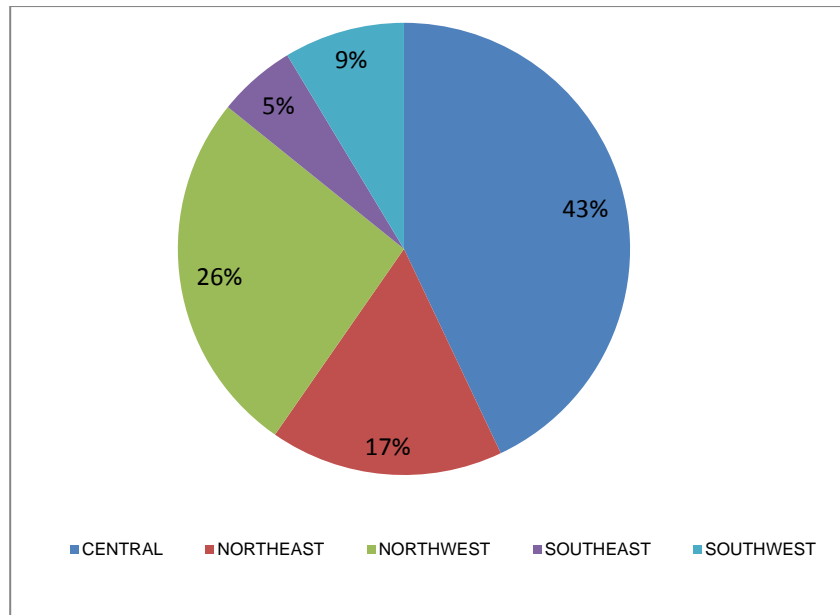

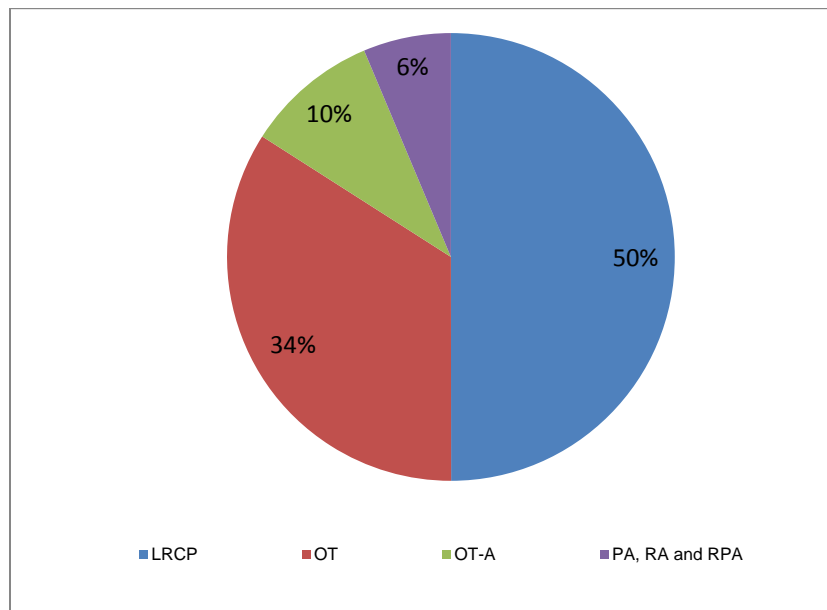

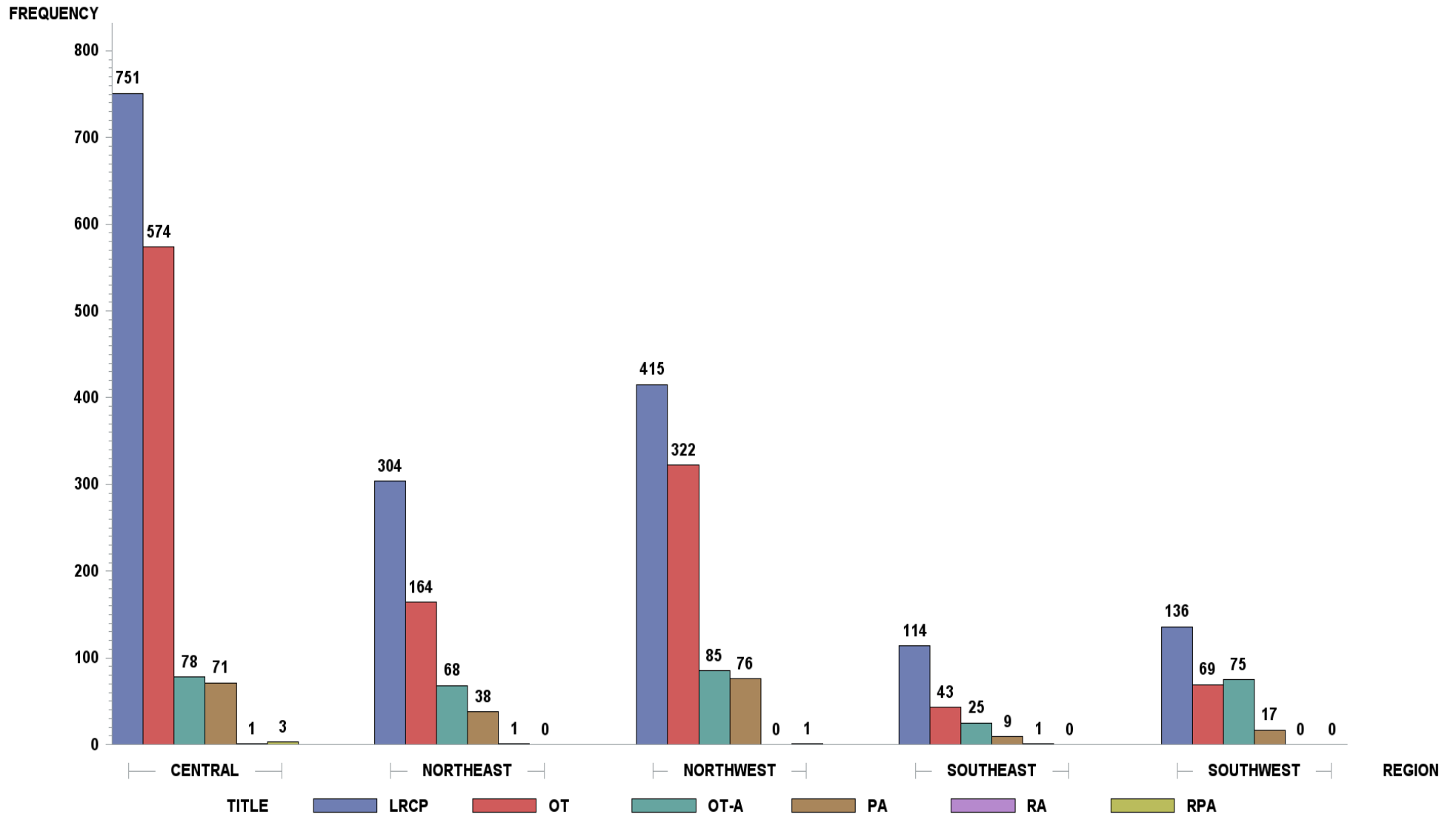
**Health Related Professionals by Region**



**Health Related Professionals by Specialty**

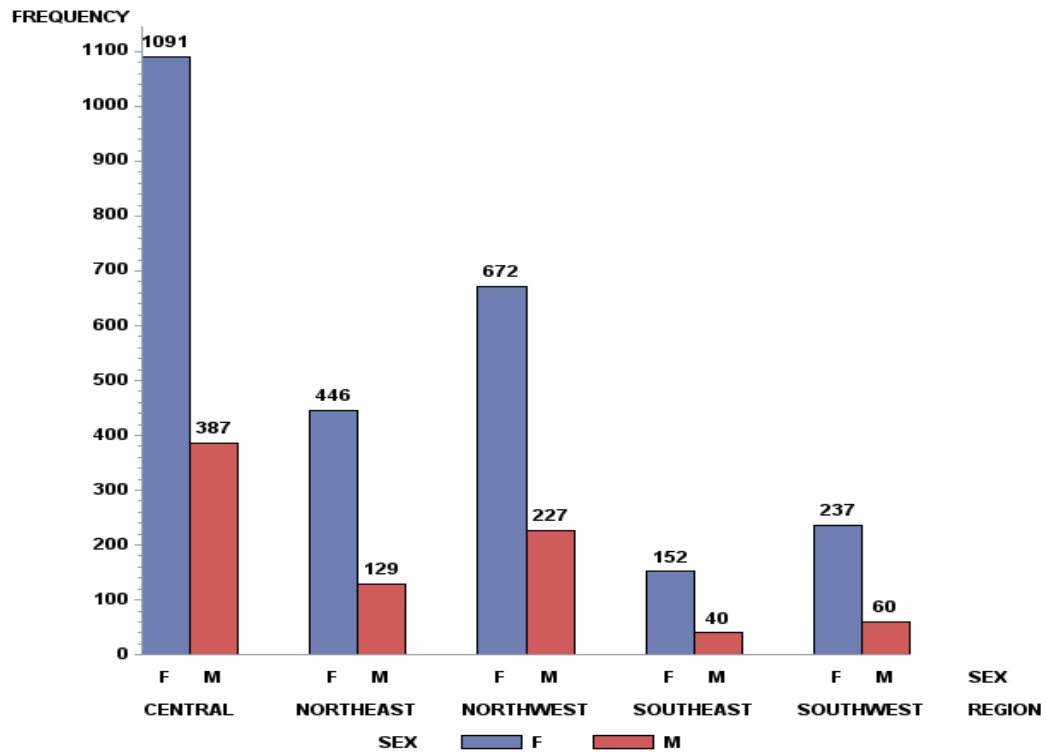


# Health Related Professionals by Regions and Specialty

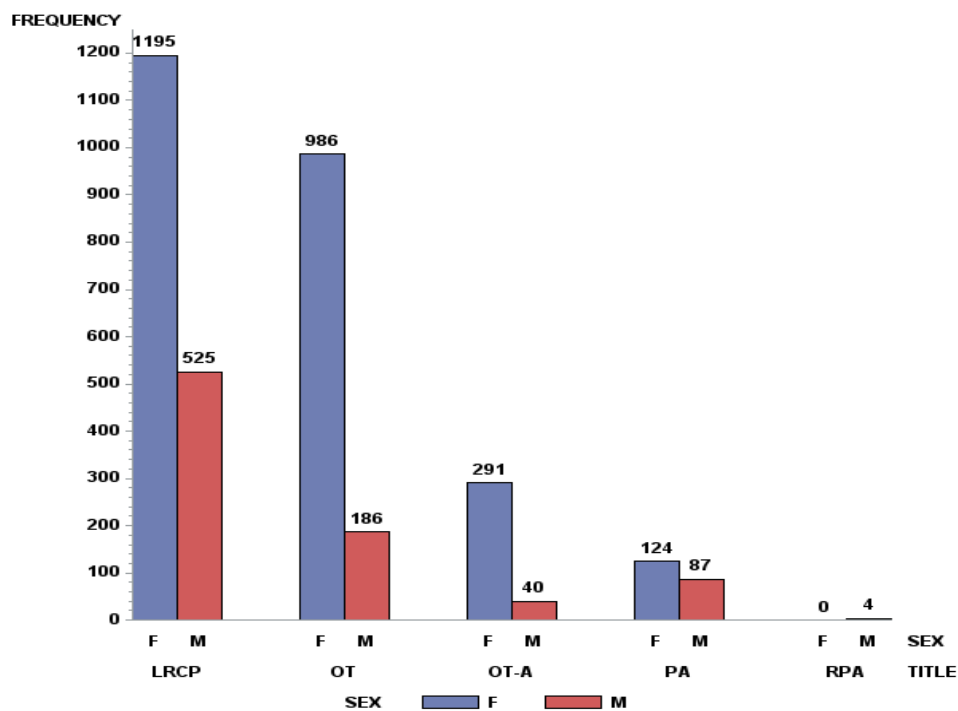

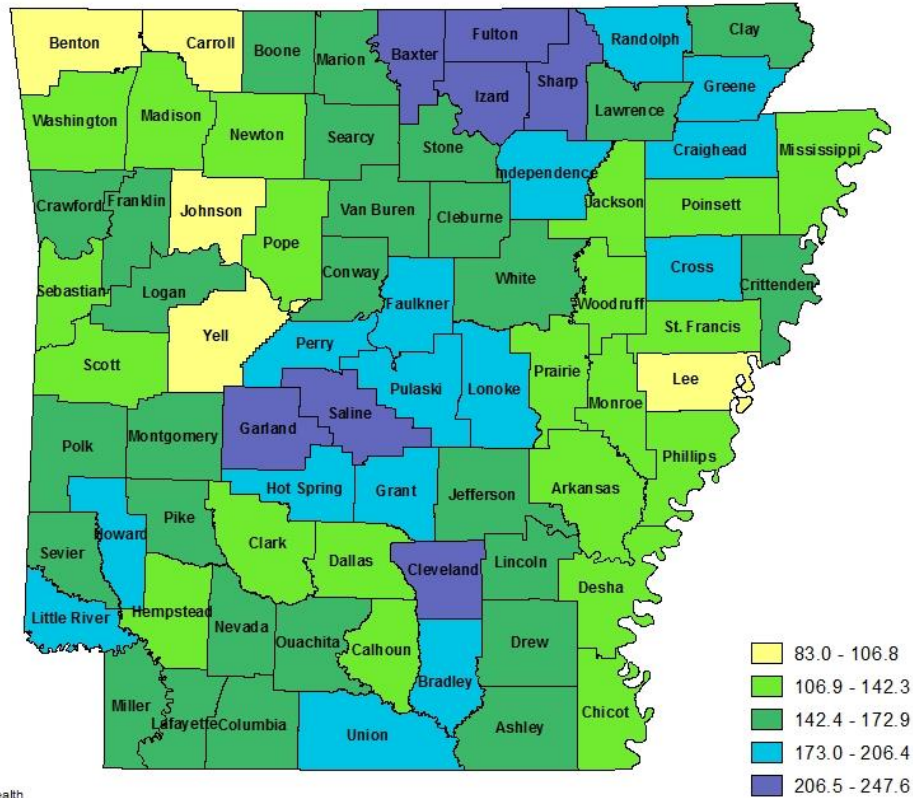


## **Nurses in Arkansas**

In 2013, the Nursing Board licensed 48,537 nurses with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 164 per 10,000 populations. This total includes 31,690 Registered Nurses (RN), 14,274 Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN), 102 Licensed Psychiatric Technician Nurses (LPTN), and 414 Registered Nurse Practitioners (RNP). There were 2,057 nurses registered as Advanced Practice Nurses (APN). These 48,537 nurses had a total of 51,816 licenses but for the purposes of this report we used the following hierarchy to take the highest of the five license types: LPN < LPTN < RN < RNP < APN. The APNs consist of 4 different licenses but will be grouped together for the majority of this section. They will be broken down into individual licenses later in the section. The number of licensed nurses for the state increased 2.3% from 2012 to 2013.

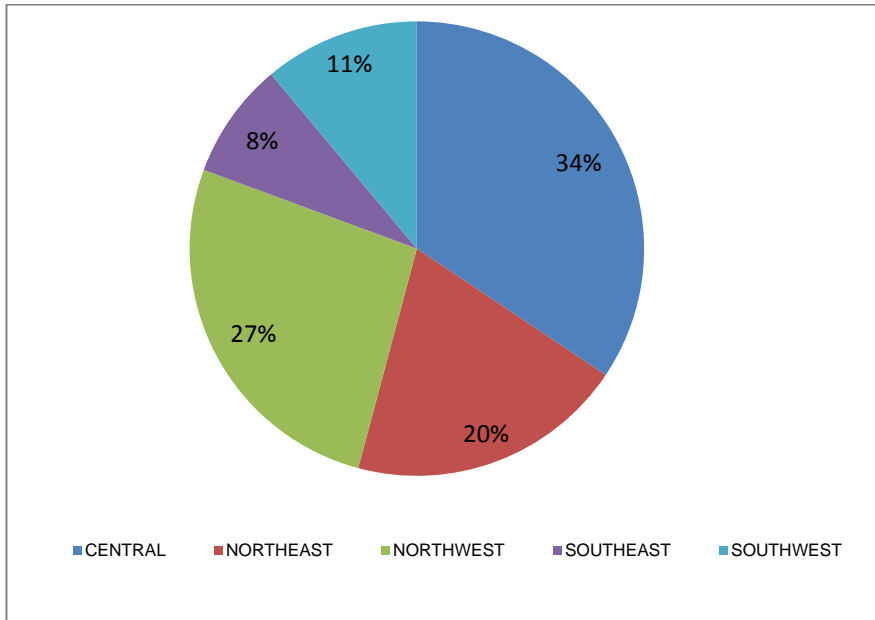
*After completing basic nursing programs, RN and LPN must pass nationally standardized examinations. LPTN must have passed a state licensure exam. RNP have completed a nurse practitioner program in addition to their RN program. To be licensed as an APN, an RN must complete an advanced practice nursing program and hold certification from a Board approved, nationally recognized, certifying body.*

## Nurses by Counties Per 10,000 Population

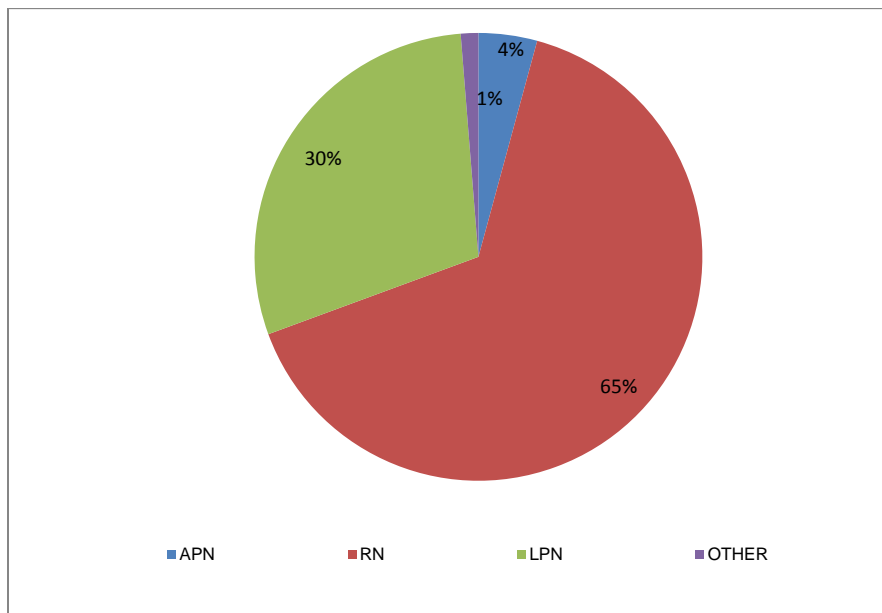

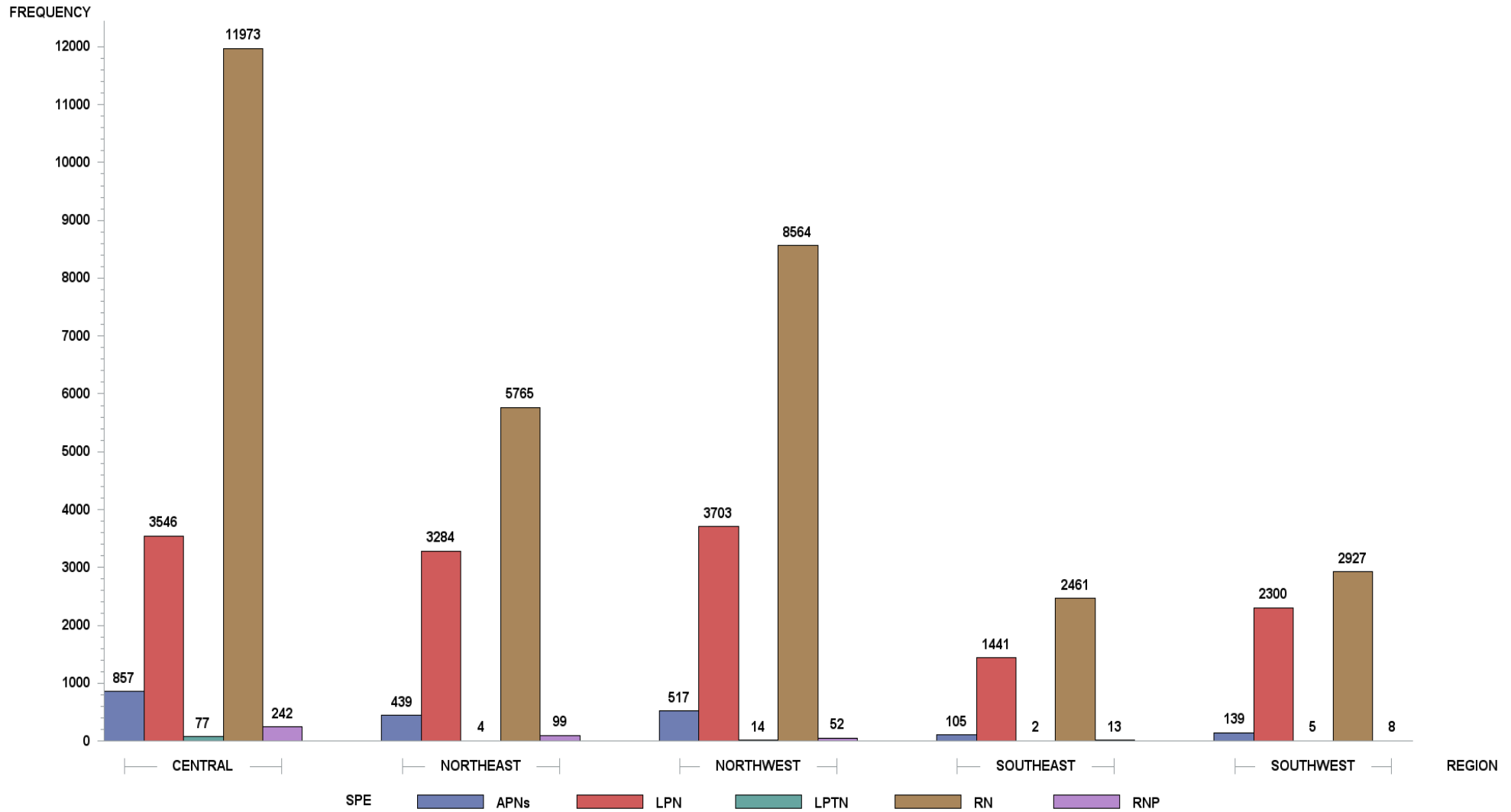
### Distribution of Nurses by Region



**Distribution of Nurses by Title**

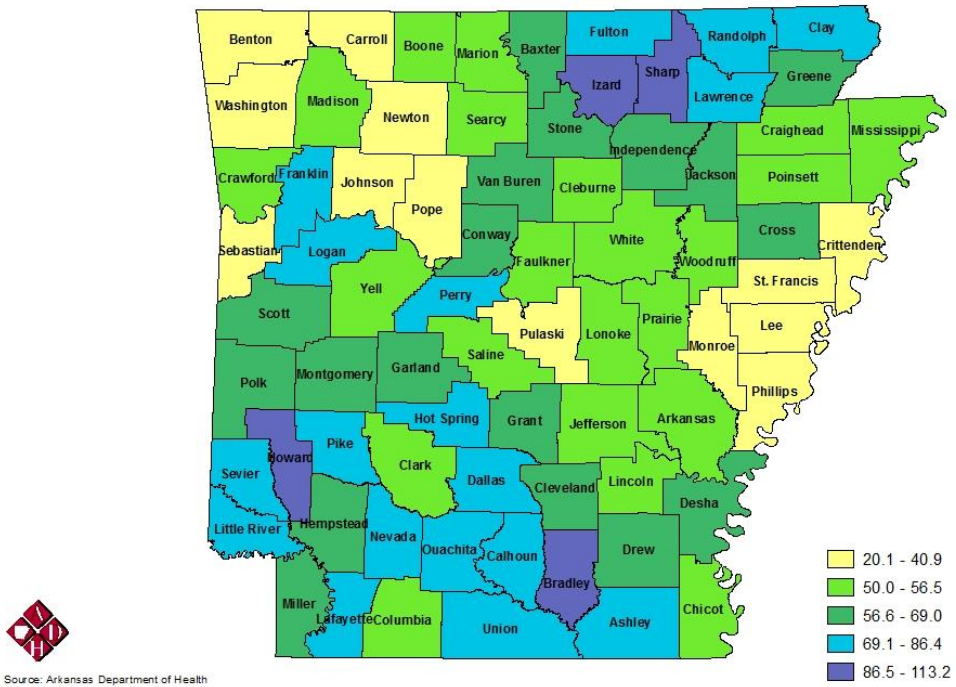

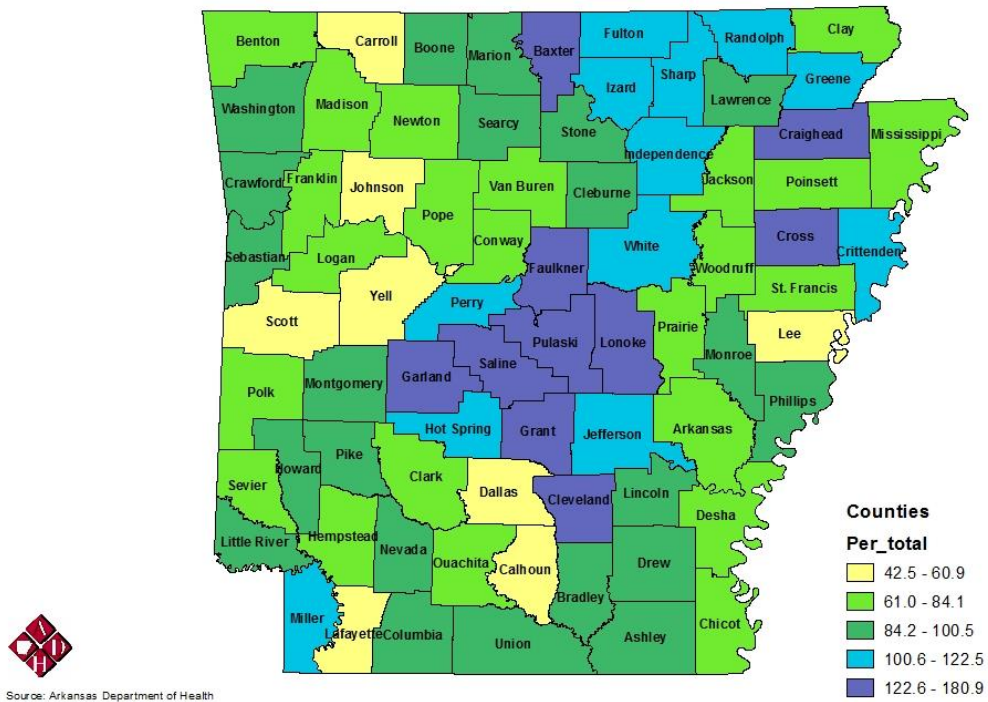

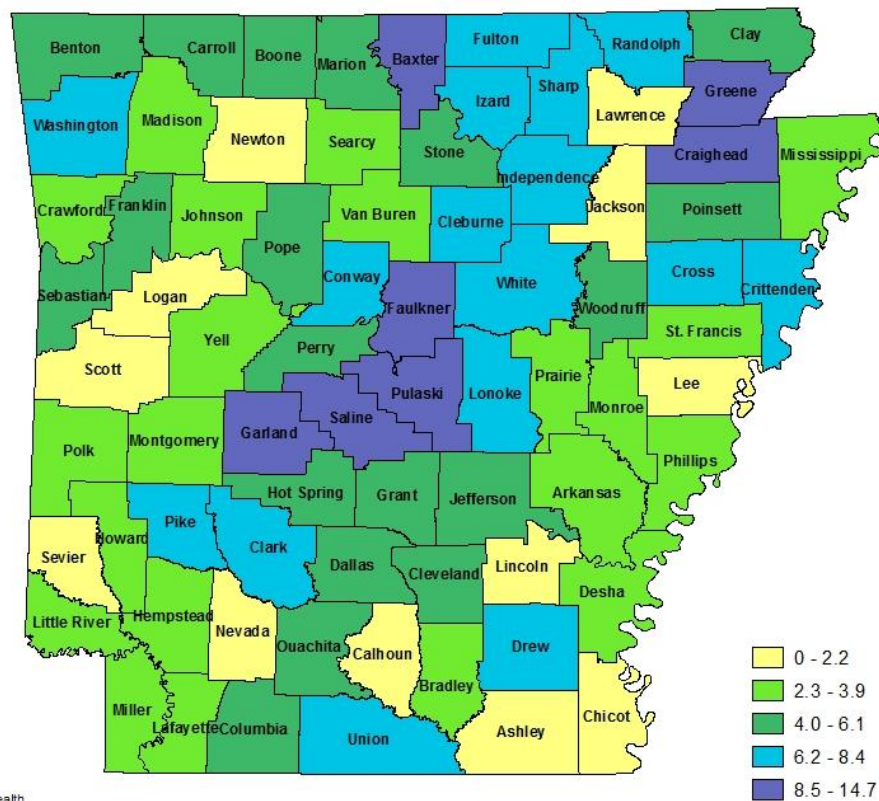

At this point in the section we will look at the Advanced Practice Nurse group and break it down into the individual license types. The four licenses in this category: Certified Nurse Midwife (CNM), Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS), Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA), and Certified Nurse Practitioner (CNP). Certified Nurse Practitioner has replaced the term Advanced Nurse Practitioner (ANP). These four licenses are considered equal in educational requirements so there is not a hierarchy for this group. Since they are considered equal, the nurses that have more than one APN license will be counted in the analysis for each license they have.

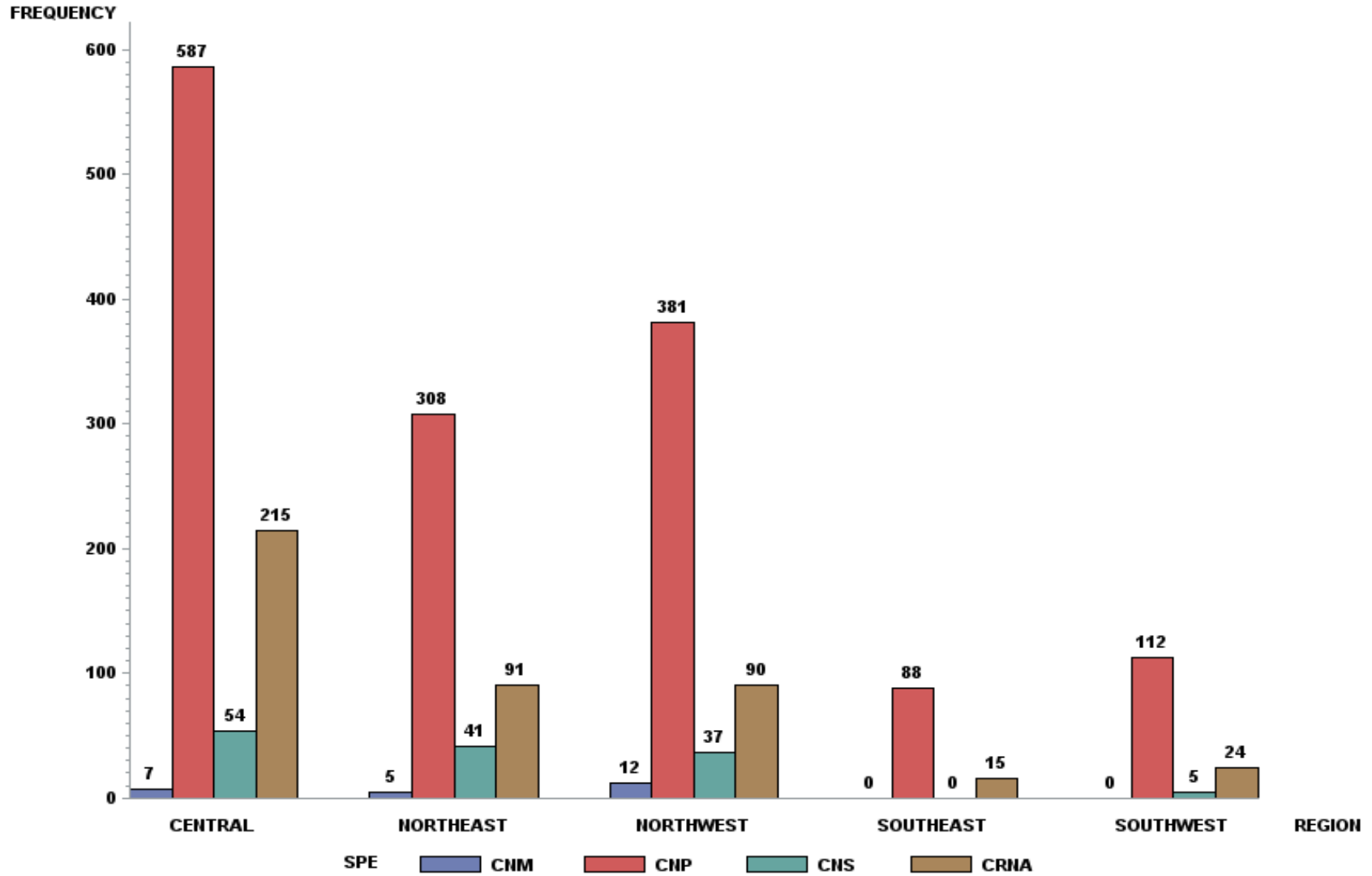
There are 2,057 Advanced Practice Nurses with a total of 2,072 licenses. This total includes 1,476 Certified Nurse Practitioners (CNP), 24 Certified Nurse Midwives (CNM), 137 Clinical Nurse Specialists (CNS), and 435 Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists (CRNA).

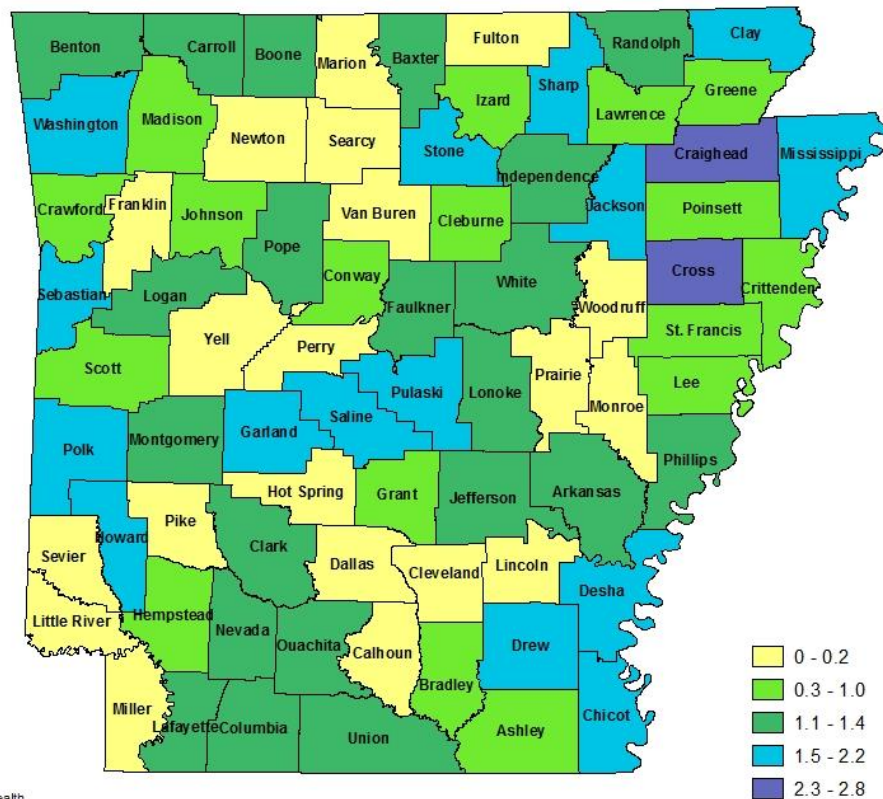

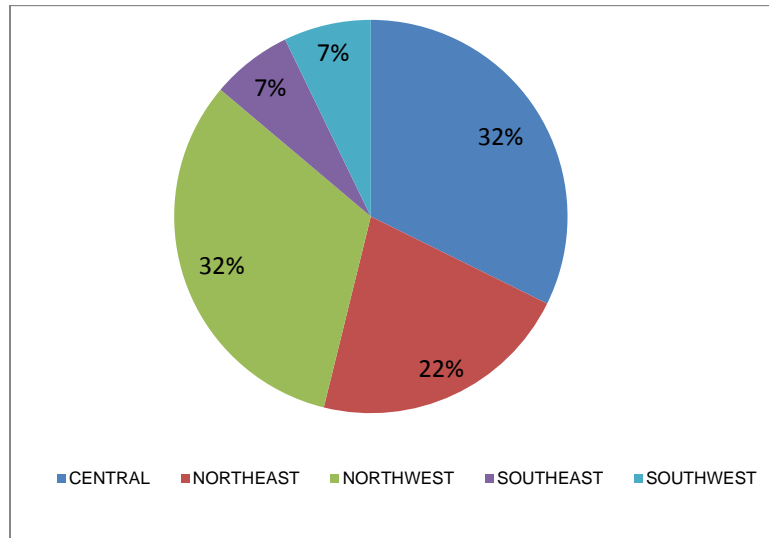
### Optometrists by Counties Per 10,000 Population



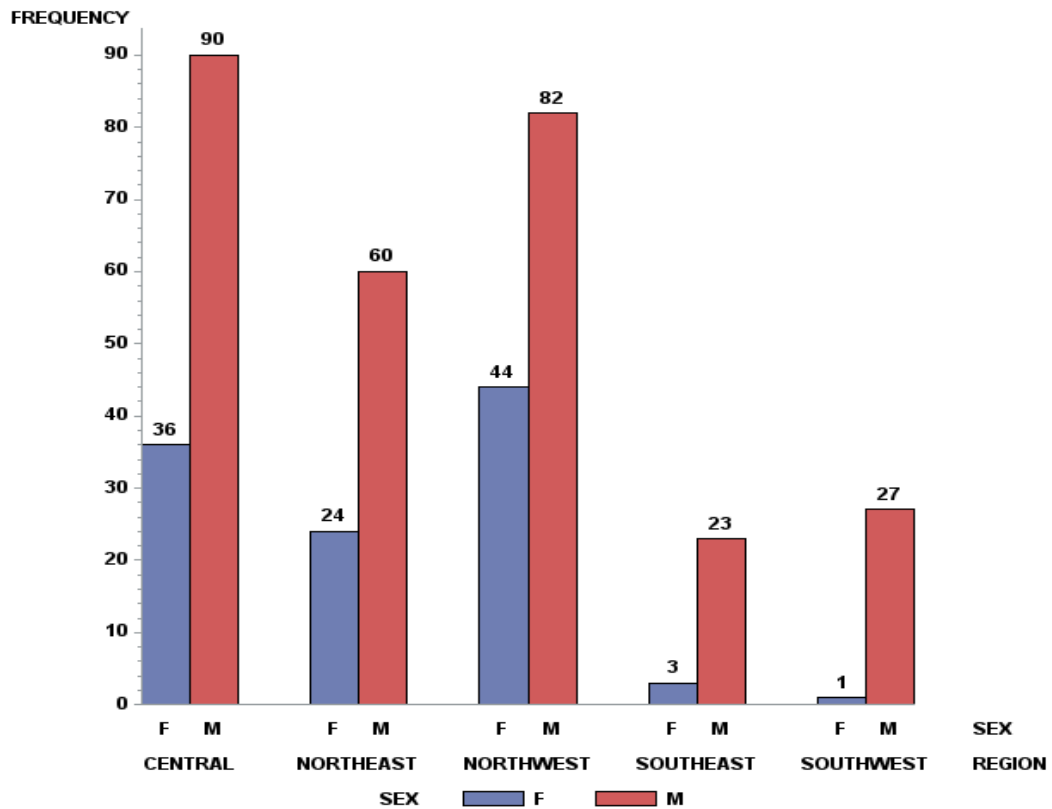

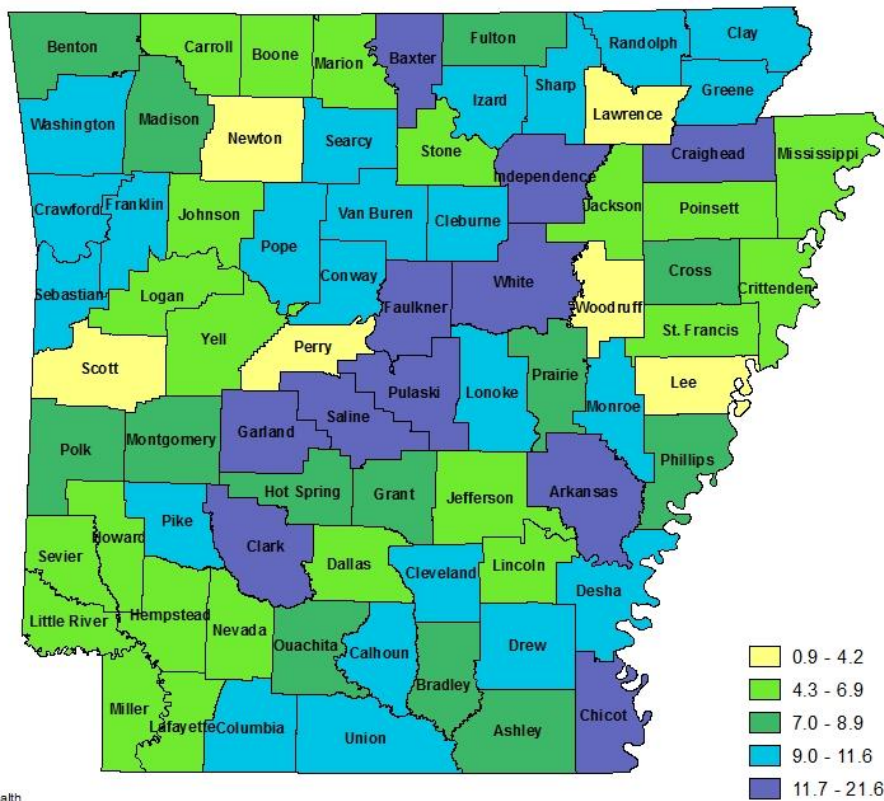

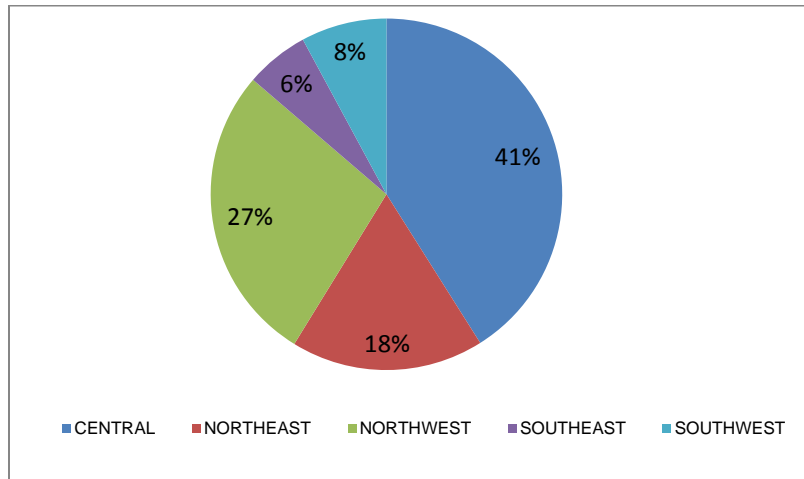
### Pharmacists by Counties Per 10,000 Population



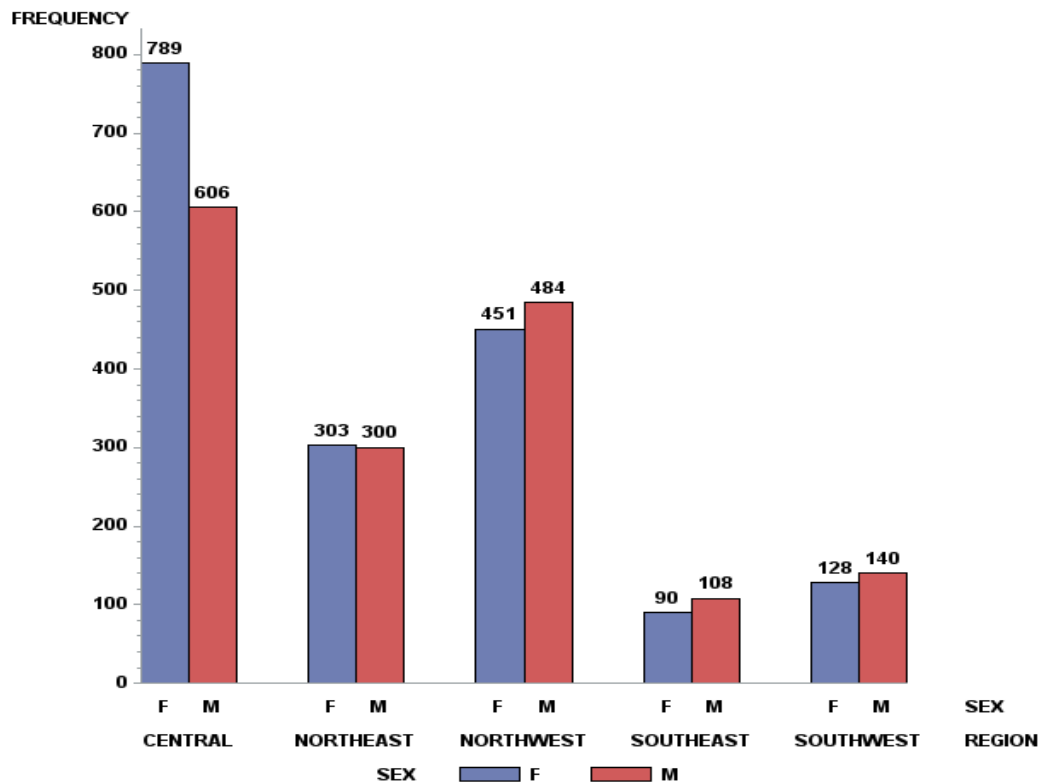

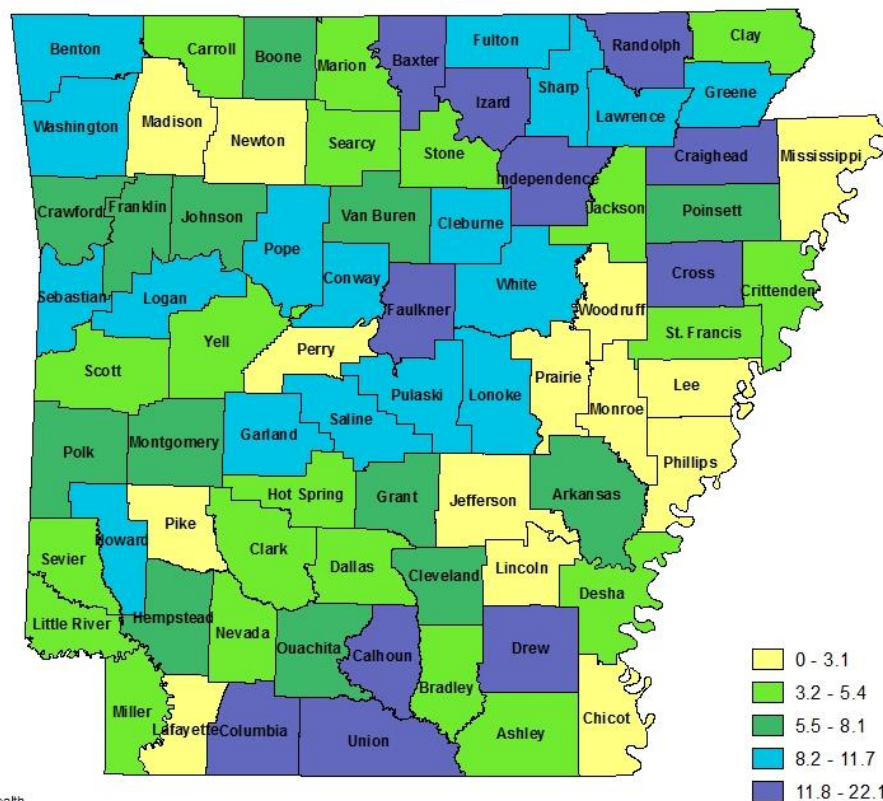

## Physical Therapists in Arkansas

In 2013, the Physical Therapy Board licensed 1,721 Physical Therapists (PT), about 5.8 per 10,000 population, and 1,084 Physical Therapist Assistants (PTA), about 3.6 per 10,000 population, with mailing addresses in Arkansas. Of the 75 counties in Arkansas, one (1.3%) county had no registered physical therapist or physical therapist assistant and three (4%) counties had only one physical therapist with no physical therapist assistant in the registry.

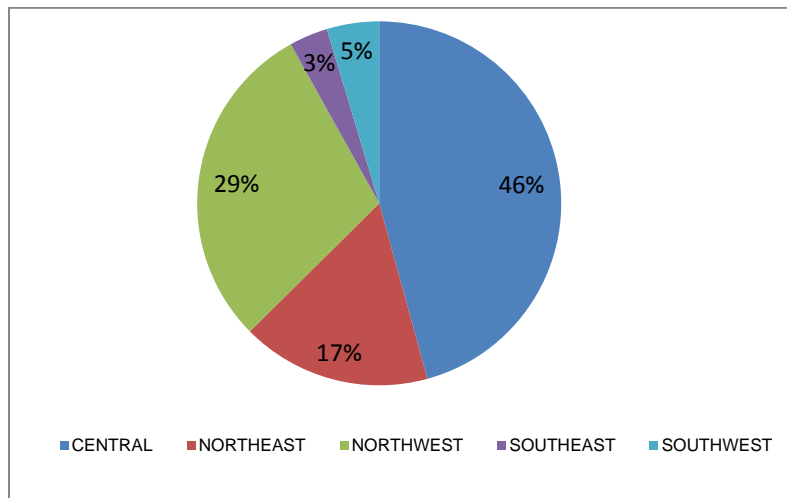
### Physical Therapists by Counties Per 10,000 Population



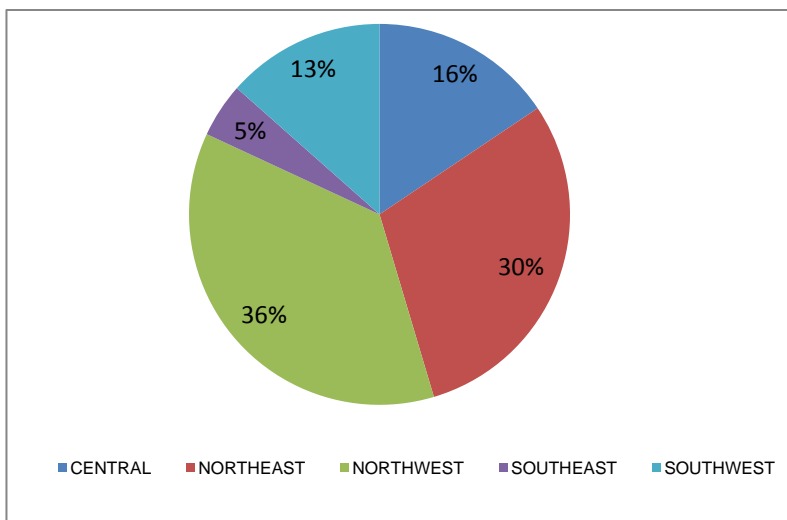

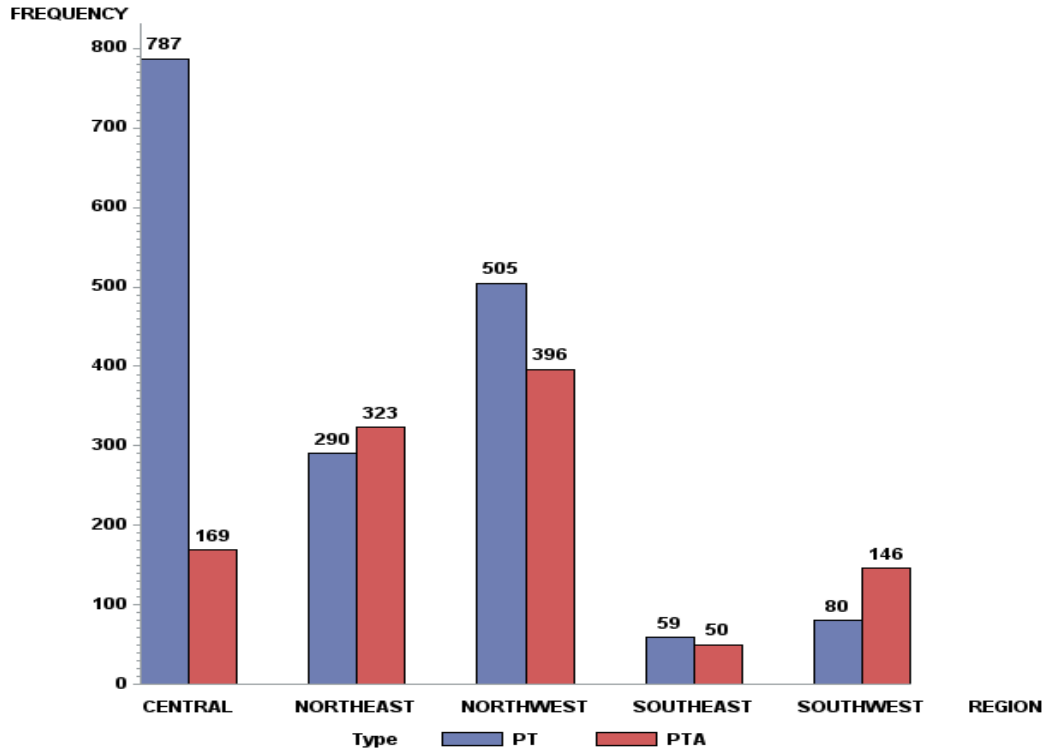

**Physical Therapists by Regions**

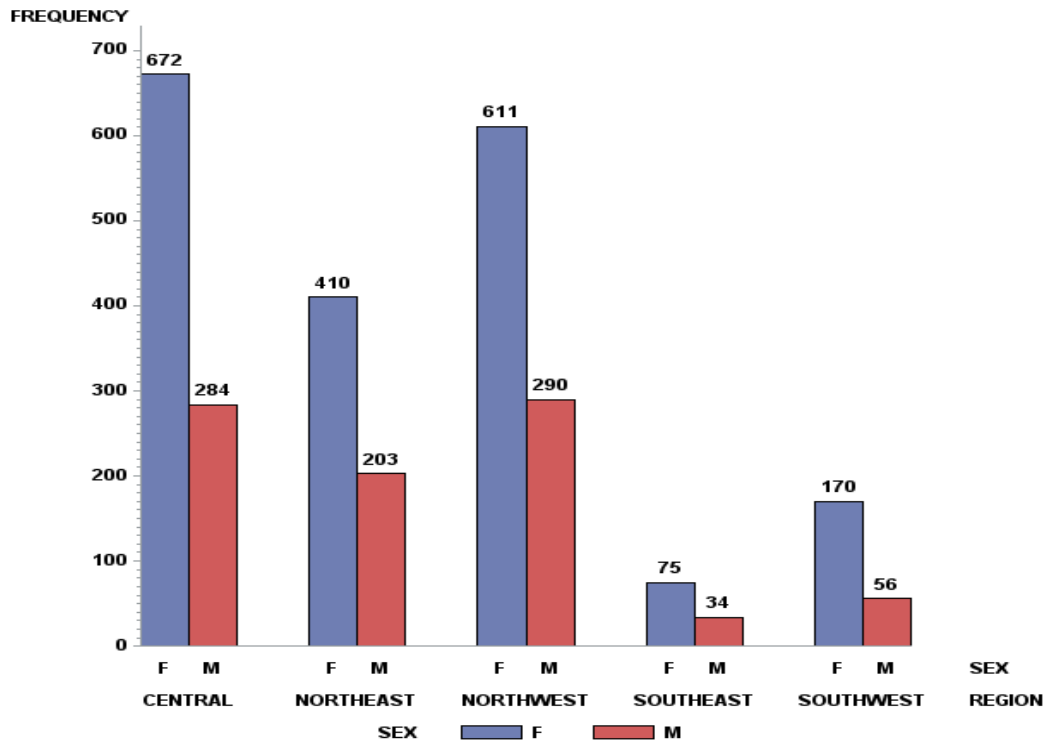


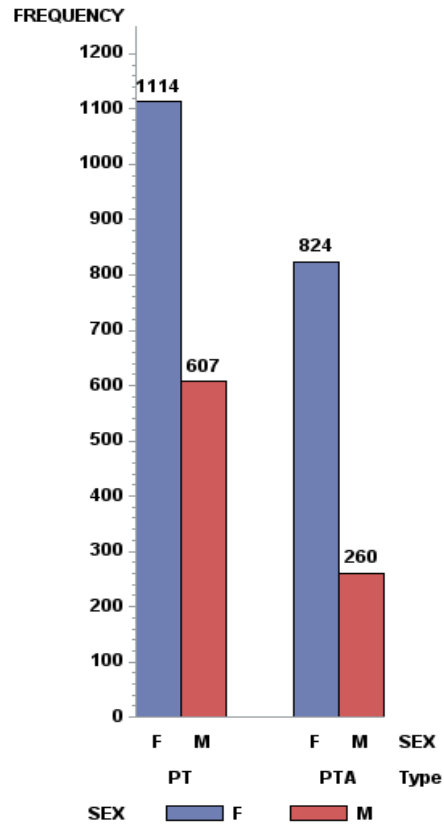
**Physical Therapist Assistants by Regions**

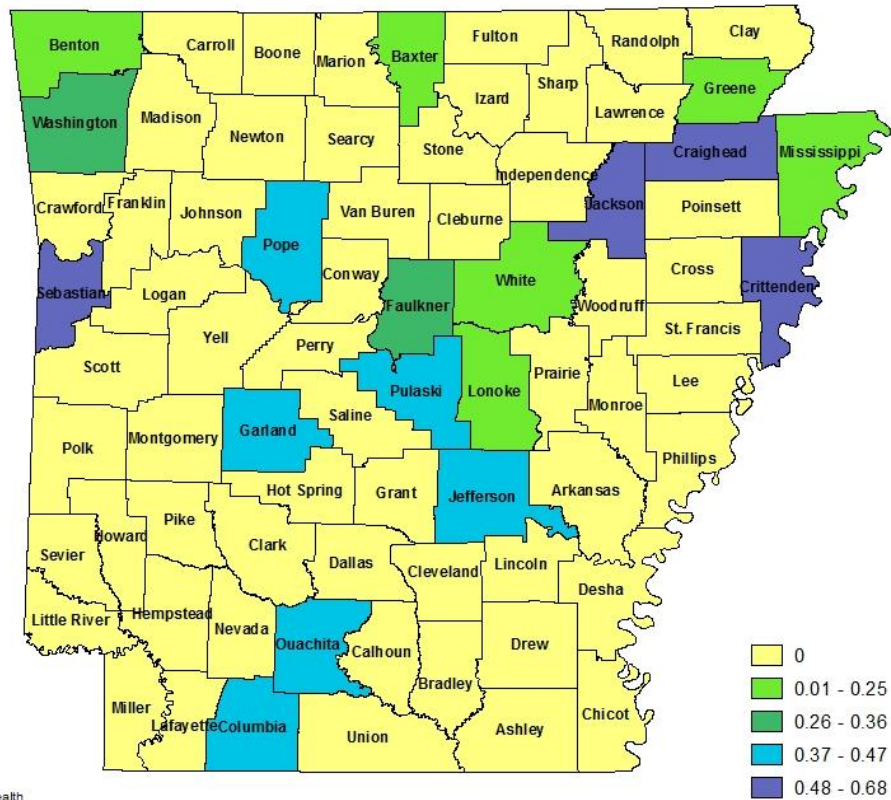

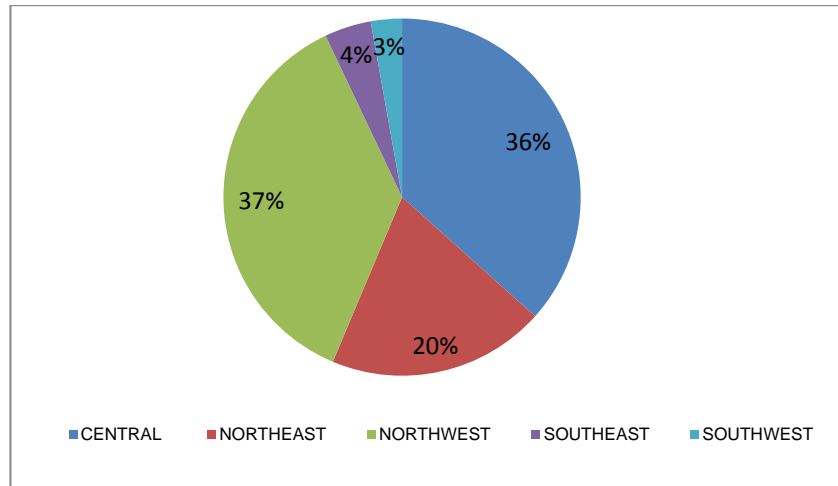
### Podiatrists by Counties Per 10,000 Population



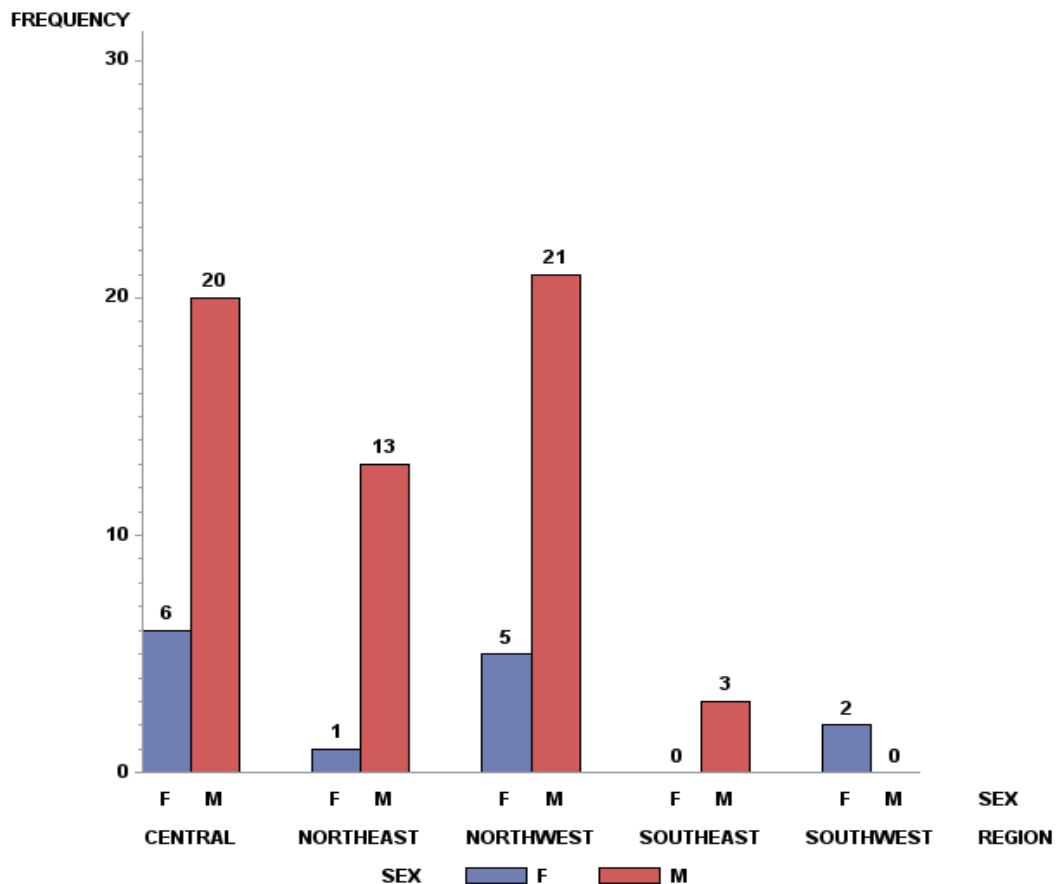

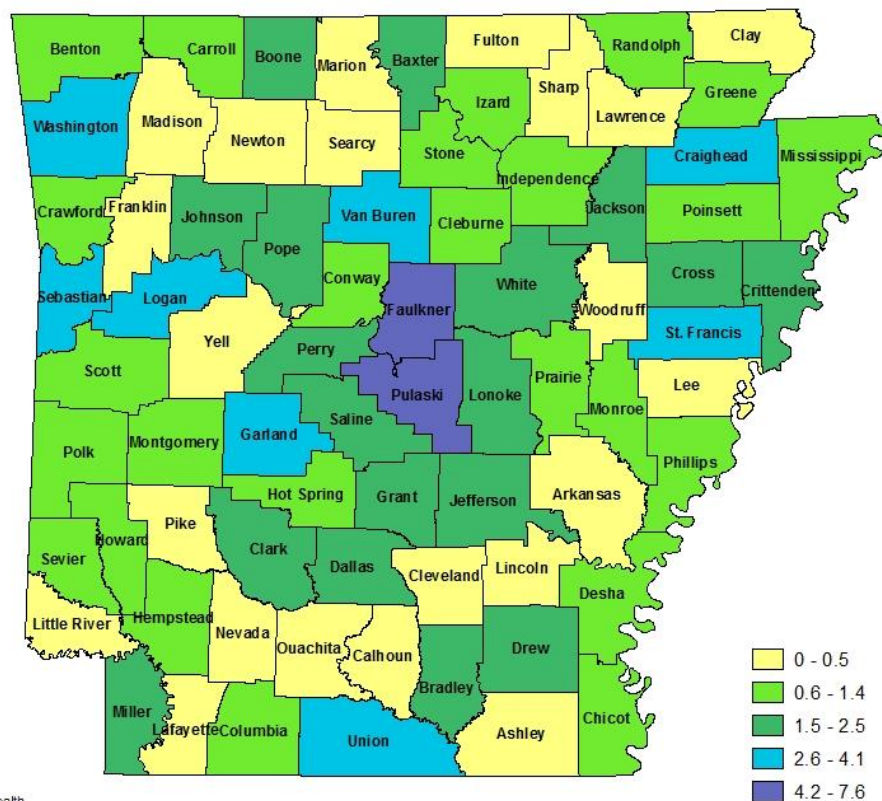

## Psychology Examiners in Arkansas

In 2013, the Psychology Board licensed 829 psychologists with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 3 per 10,000 population. This total includes 445 Psychologists (P), 173 Psychologists Examiners (E), and 211 Psychological Examiner Independents (EI); about 1.5, 0.6 and 0.7 respectively, per 10,000 population. Of the 75 Arkansas counties, 19 (25%) did not have a registered psychologist and 11 (15%) of the counties had only one.

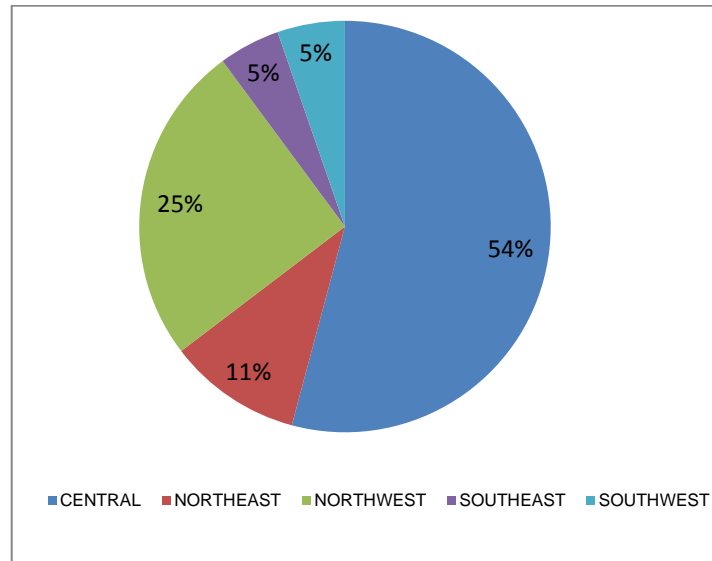
### Psychologists by Counties Per 10,000 Population



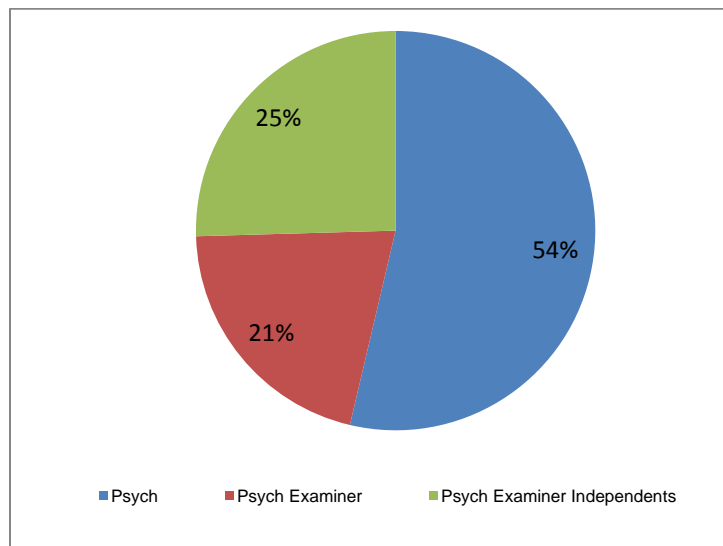

**Distribution of Psychologists by Region**

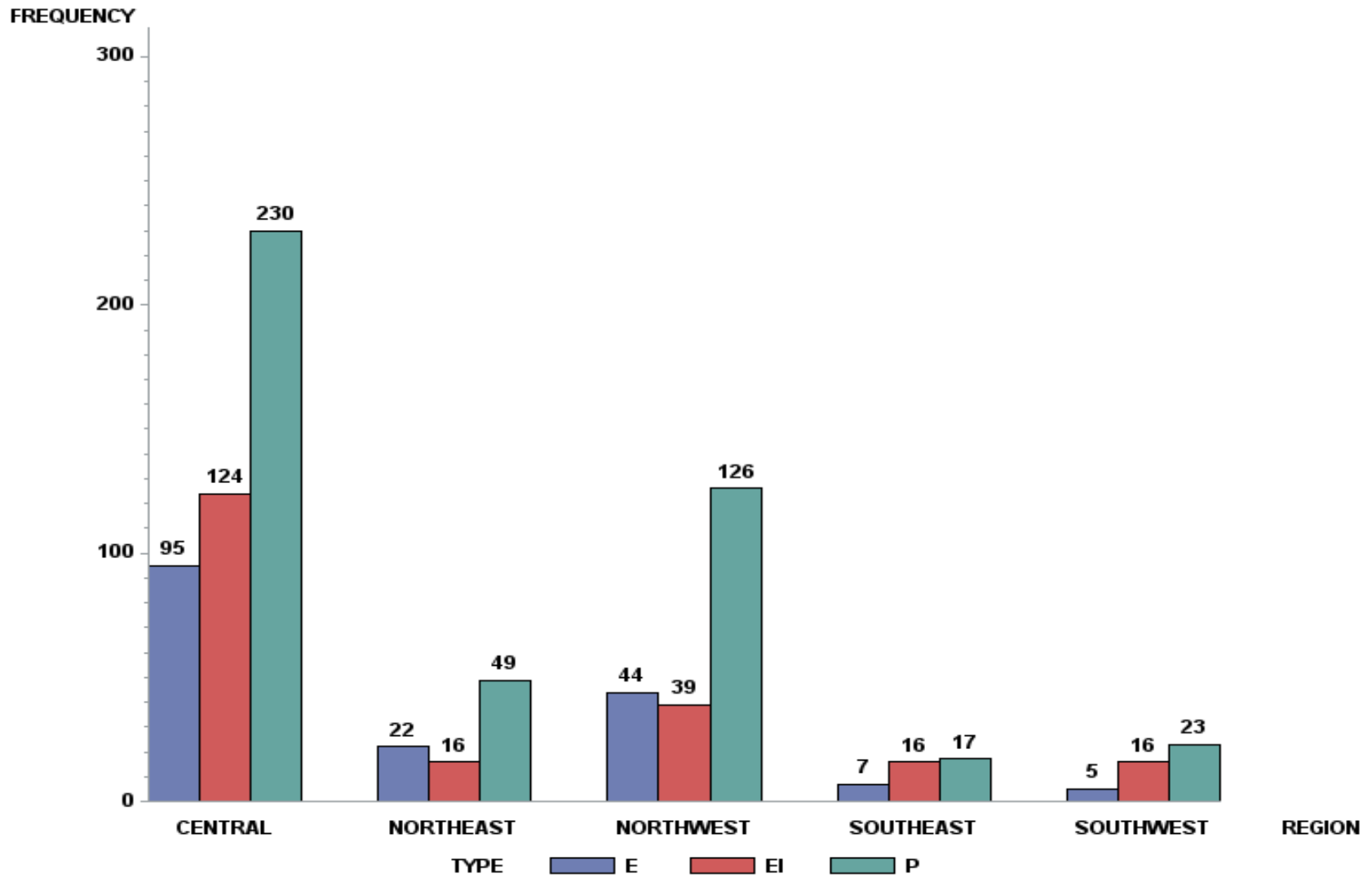


**Distribution of Psychologists by Title**

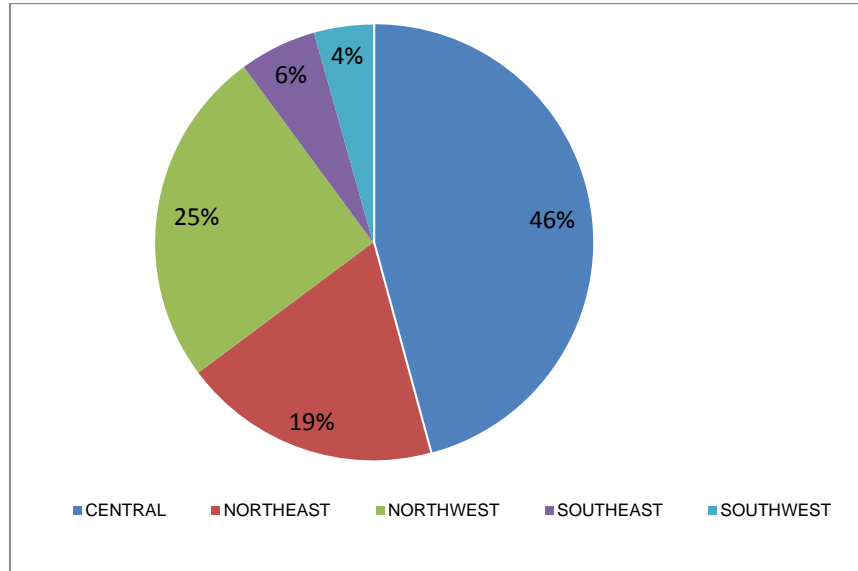

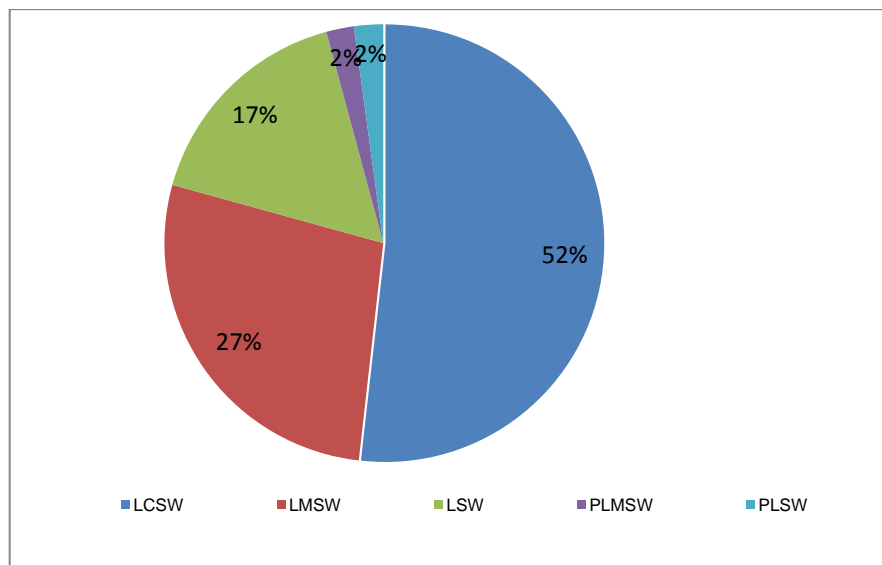

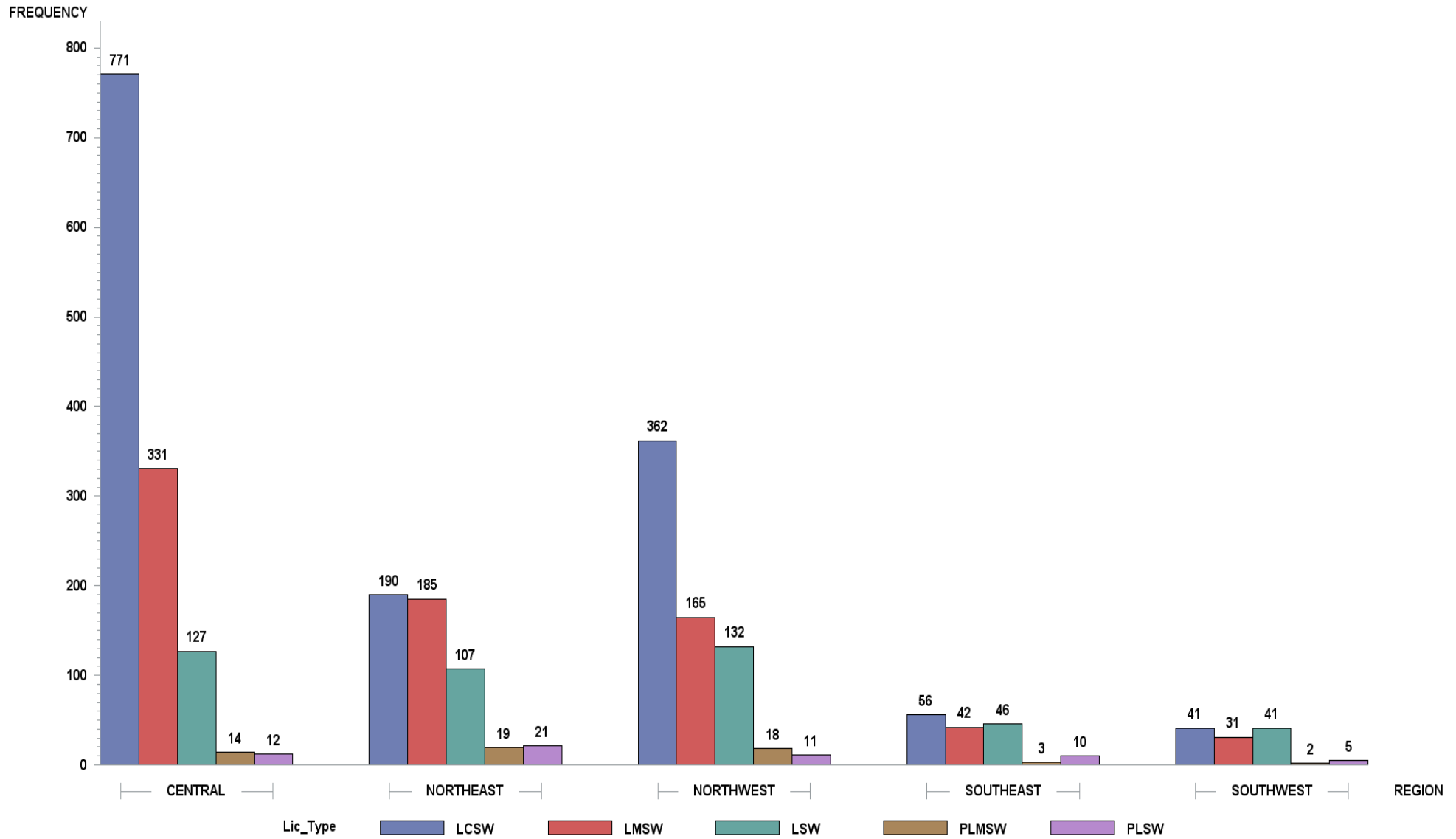
**Distribution of Social Workers by Region**

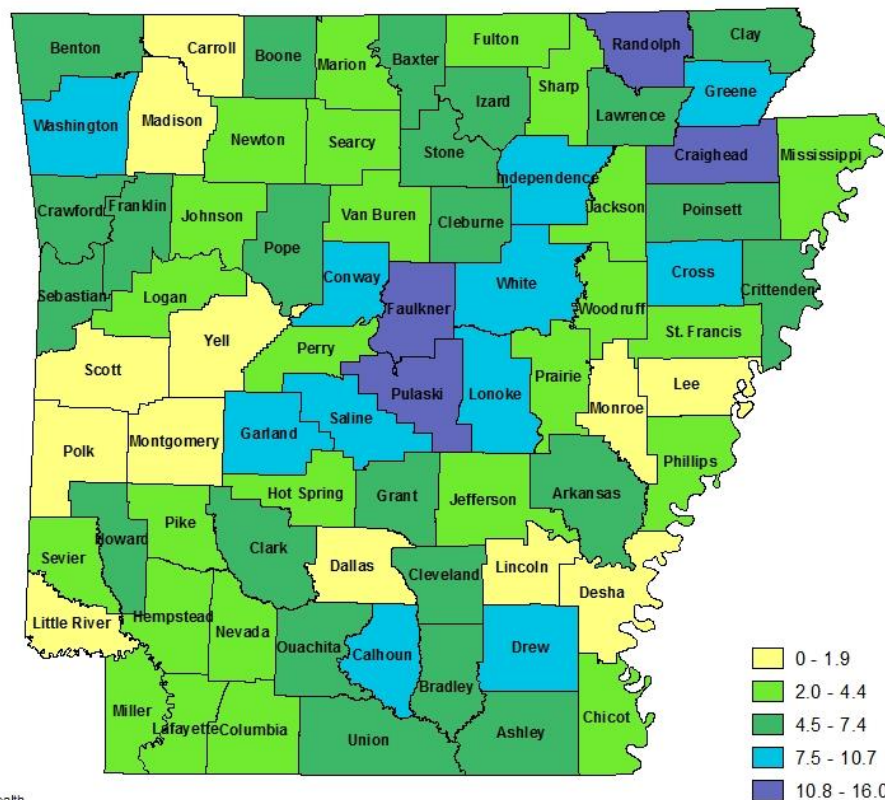

## Speech Pathologists and Audiologists in Arkansas

In 2013, the Speech Pathology and Audiology Board licensed 2,191 speech pathologists, about 7 per 10,000 populations, and 149 audiologists, about 0.5 per 10,000 populations, with mailing addresses in Arkansas. Of the 75 counties in Arkansas, 2 (2.6%) counties had no registered speech pathologists or audiologists and 51 (68%) counties had one or more speech pathologists but no audiologists in the registry.

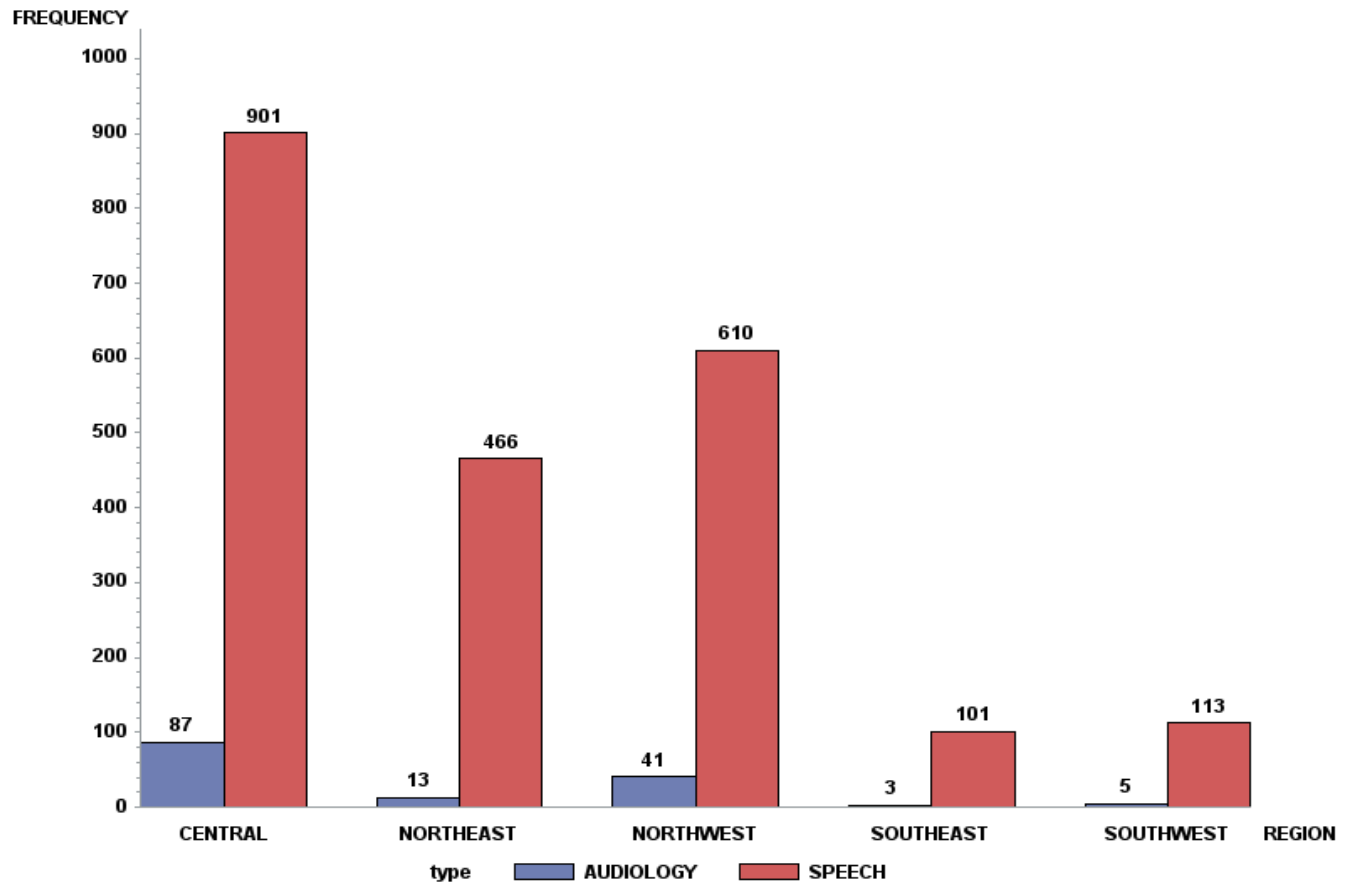
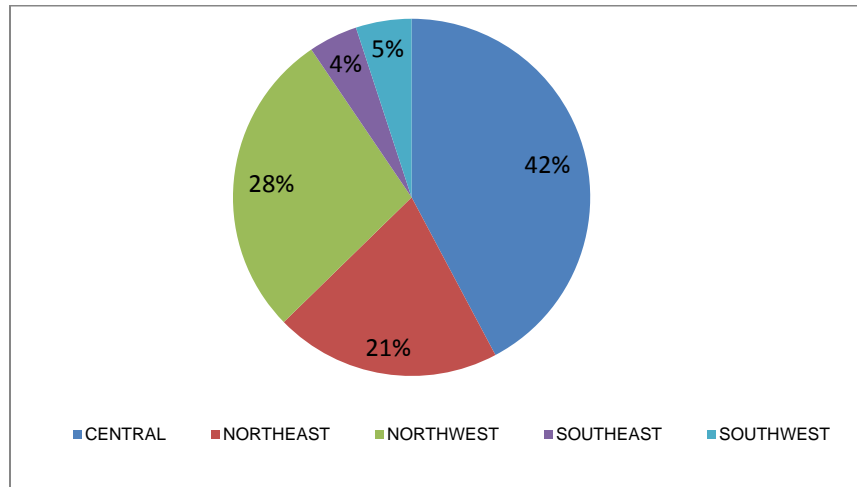
**Speech Pathologists and Audiologists by Counties  
Per 10,000 Population**



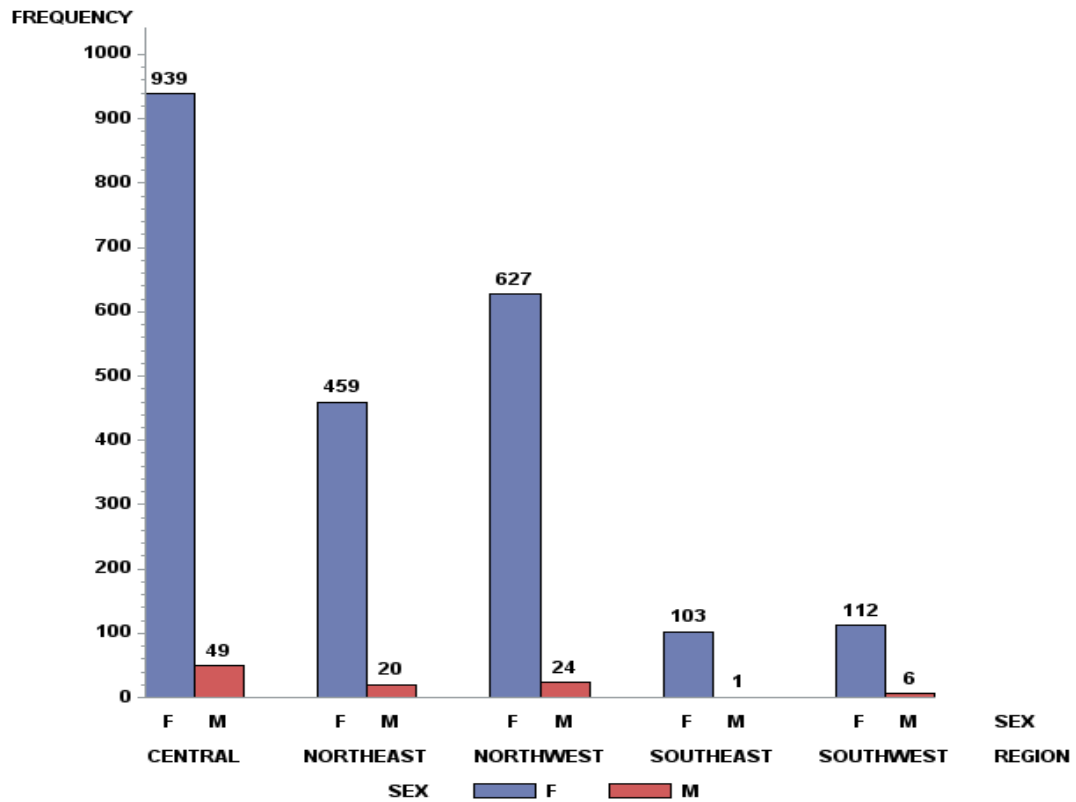

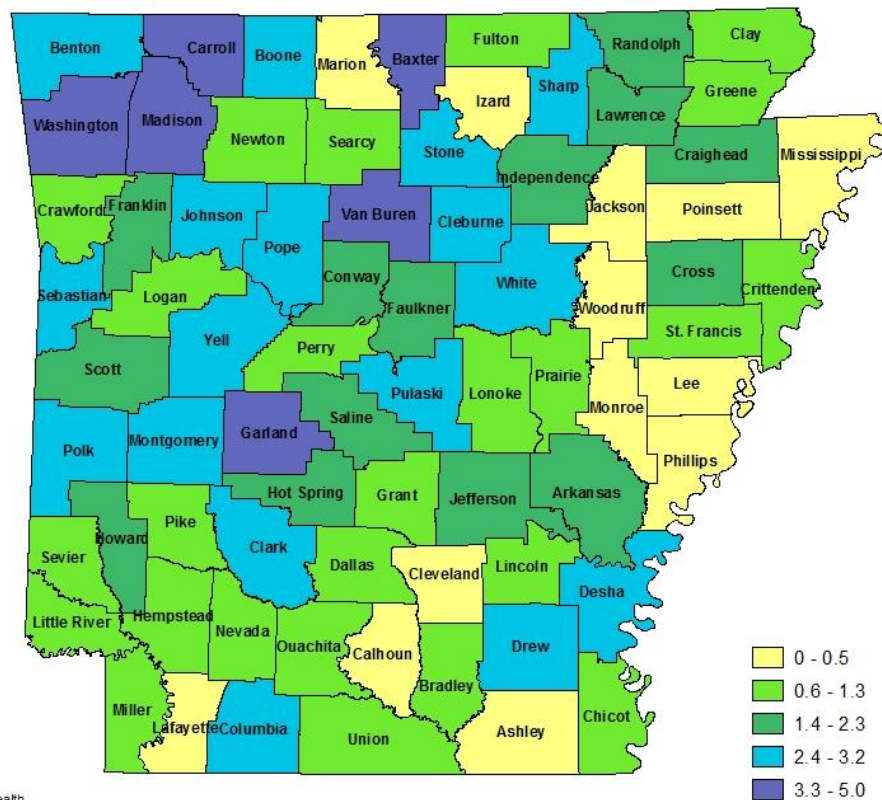

### Veterinarians by Counties Per 10,000 Population

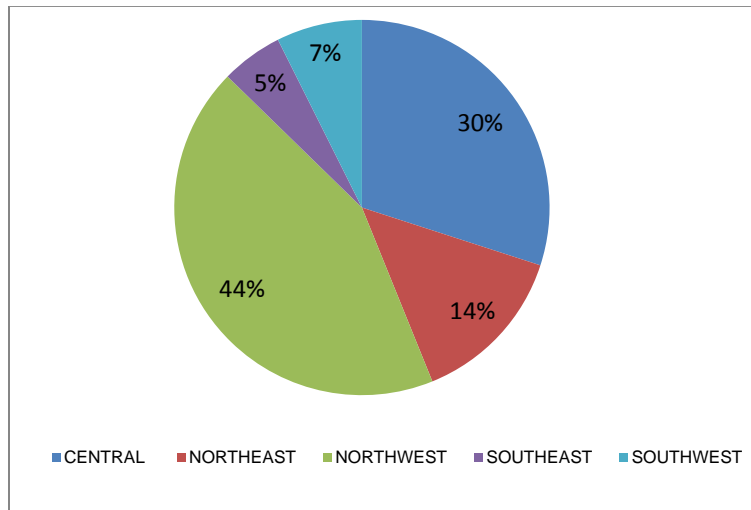
